




Inaugural and welcome note by Prof. Dr. B.H.Sutar, Principal B.V.D.U. College of Architecture, Pune.



First Session was by Dr. V. R. Shirgurkar, Senior Academic Consultant presenting his thoughts on Quality in Higher Education -in the context of NAAC Metrics. He highlighted on the concepts of quality in higher education in the context of the NAAC metrics. Unless quality can be measured, it cannot be improved. NAAC has accepted this by introducing quantitative metrics. He covered how fitness for the purpose, value for money and quest for excellence can be introduced while integrating quality in teaching learning and evaluation.



Second Session was Dr.C. N. Rawal, Ex Principal-BMCC, Pune explained the Documentation Process for NAAC. In order to process for accreditation and assessment evidence in various forms are significant and university must establish SOP to maintain all such documents /evidence /proofs in a manner to access, extract required data with the help of most modern technology to suit requirement of time and technology. Due to online assessment such evidence became backbone of grading system. Document refers to material that provides official information, evidence or record. The list of documents required and the files to be prepared before applying for the NAAC Accreditation must be in the right PDF format.





#### Day 2- 20th APRIL 2021 Tuesday: 9:30 am to 2:30 pm

First Session was by Dr.C. N. Rawal, Ex Principal-BMCC, Pune explained the Documentation Process for NAAC Whereas documentation refers to the process of classifying, annotating texts, photos etc. It also consists of description of event between 200 to 500 words, templates, Tabular Formats, Percentage / Average, Video, Scanned Documents, Web Link and PDF uploads. There is need to develop institutional SOPs to collect, classify, analyze, store and retrieve necessary evidence.



Second Session was by Dr. Nalini Patil, Principal, SNDT College of Education, Pune who explained Best Practices for Criteria 1-7 and also conducted interactive session with participants. The session was divided into three part: first presentation, second interaction and third question and answers session. The seminar covered the detailed process of writing best practices along with how to select best practices for each NAAC Criterion. It explained the factors to be considered while choosing the best practices. The talk also included explanation of steps to implement the best practices effectively. The seminar was more like a workshop, where all participants presented best practices according to the process.



### 1) Students learning-

Qualitative efforts are taken by each faculty for all-round development of students. Regular lectures, Practicals and demonstrations are conducted as per scheduled time table. To encourage the students, various references from reference books, educational websites, etc. are given.

During lockdown period all the faculty organized their online lectures through ZOOM meetings, Google class etc as per their routine schedule. All students and faculty were enrolled on Microsoft platform for teaching and learning. Students were oriented to various academic training programmes. The students are asked to attend Webinars, You tube VDOs. For clinical batches live patients demonstration is given in the clinics. Regular tutorials, terminal and qualifying examinations are held as per schedule and assessment is done with grades.

For unsuccessful students re-exams are conducted for improvement of their academics and remedial classes were conducted for slow learners.

During internship students are allotted small research projects on various clinical conditions and efficacy of homoeopathy in these conditions.

The Internees research work is guided properly and evaluated by conducting their presentations.

In the current scenario college conducted the Qualifying and terminal examinations online and assessment also done online.

All classes' students are divided into small groups [10-12 students] and each such group is posted to a teacher.

Monthly meetings are taken by respective mentor teacher for his/her group students.

Following is the agenda of for such a meeting –

Personal problems regarding health, Academic Difficulties of various subject faced by student.

The students are also motivated to participate in various curricular and extracurricular activities and Interdisciplinary Research projects.

### 2) Infrastructure Highlights

The college ensures optimal allocation and utilization of the available financial recourses for maintenance and upkeep of different facilities

Non clinical departments have well equipped laboratories in the college building. The calibration, repairing and maintenance of sophisticated lab equipment's are done by the professional technicians.

The central library in the college for UG and in the hospital building for PG has ample amount of text and reference books, national and International Journals available for reading and reference. It has DELNET facility and separate Computer section to utilize foe e learning and references. Computer maintenance through AMC is done regularly and non-repairable systems are disposed of.

Classrooms-Adequate, well ventilated and specious classrooms with ICT facilities are available for UG in college building and for PG in hospital building. Special rooms for Clinical departments and PG departments are in hospital building.

General and special wards available in the hospital for IPD patients. A well-equipped operation theatre in the hospital where minor surgical procedures are carried out.

A specious seminar hall with technology support is in the hospital building where various seminars, workshops and eminent lectures are organized.

### 3) Research-publications, projects in brief

All the students and faculty members are asked to submit their Research Proposals time to time. During last year Short –term Student scholarship in Homoeopathy (STSH) Total fellowship was granted to 03 students by Central Council of Research in Homoeopathy. Research funds are sanctioned for major research project of "Evaluating the anticancer activity of homoeopathic preparation of Linum usitatissimum in breast cancer "funded by CCRH for INR-42, 02,000 lacs. For 3 years.

Many minor projects are also in progress. One project is sanctioned by Industry Wilmar Schwabe for Rs 4000/-.

33 Publications are notified on UGC website on an International level with average impact factor 5.

Many of our PG scholars and PhD are working on cellular study, In-vitro and plant study of Homoeopathic drugs.

### 4) Exemplary Practices

- Institution had linkages for internship in Industrial training for PG scholars of Homoeopathic Pharmacy at Willmar Schwabe India Pvt. Ltd India for 05 days. (11-03-2019 to 15-3-2019). 6 students from M.D (HOM) participated in the same.
- M.O.U is signed by the Institution with Wilmar Schwabe India Pvt. Ltd India on 3 April 2019.
- Hon'ble Dr. Patangraoji Kadam Post Graduate Scientific Concave in Homoeopathy on 16th April 2019 was organized by PG Department, BVDU HMC. It was assessed by Faculty from RG ITBT and best presentation was awarded.
- The Institute runs Mobile Homoeopathic Clinic in 35-50 kms periphery in all directions from College namely at Yawat, Theur, Pirangut, Paud, Bhugaon, Bhor, Panshet, Ambi, Kirkitwadi, Saswad, Dehuroad and Dehugaon. This was initiated with the following aims:

### **Background**

- Medisynth Chemicals Pvt Ltd (MEDISYNTH) and Bharati Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University) (B.V.D.U.) share interests in training program for post graduate students in regards to industrial pharmacy and research activities and techniques.
- ii. The two institutions have identified that a stronger relation can be developed.
- iii. The so developed relation between the two institutions is mutually beneficial and wish to establish a more formal relationship with each other.

#### 1. Commencement and Duration

1.1. This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") shall take effect on the date of signing and shall continue for a period of 5 years.

#### 2. Force of this MOU

2.1. The areas of agreement outlined in this MOU are described to facilitate more detailed and specific negotiations between the institutions which may lead to the preparation and signing of one or more formal agreements between MEDISYNTH and B.V.D.U. Unless specifically noted herein, in particular by designating the clause as binding, this MOU is not intended to be of legal force and effect in any manner whatsoever. This MOU shall not create a legal relationship between the institutions.

#### 3. Broad Areas for Cooperation

3.1. MEDISYNTH and B.V.D.U. Homoeopathic Medical College and Hospital (B.V.D.U.H.M.C.) will discuss the possibility of cooperation in the following areas:

(a) Industrial Training Program

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- (b) Joint clinical research work specifically in areas of post marketing efficacy studies on homoeopathic medicines manufactured at Medisynth, Navi Mumbai.
- (c) Dissertation projects for B.V.D.U.H.M.C. P.G. / Ph.D. scholars at MEDISYNTH's Research facility.
- (d) Organising of joint seminars and conferences
- (e) Joint publications
- (f) Any collaborative efforts that both may deem fit from time to time.
- 3.2. Representatives of the Institutions may agree to review the operation of this MoU from time to time.

#### 4. Joint Contributions

- 4.1. Potential areas for collaborative research will be identified and recorded in subsequent research specific agreement(s) that set out appropriate and relevant contributions by the institutions. They may include
  - (a) Access to the Pharmacy for the development of knowledge of industrial pharmacy.
  - (b) Access to its research laboratories and assist in development of projects involving the institutions.
  - (c) Access to the Hospital OPD to conduct post marketing studies on products.
  - (d) MEDISYNTH and B.V.D.U. shall work specifically in the areas defined in Para 3.1.
- 4.2. The institutions acknowledge that all specific financial arrangements proposed must be negotiated and will depend upon the availability of funds and organizational approvals.

#### 5. Confidentiality and Privacy

- 5.1. MEDISYNTH and B.V.D.U. recognize that they will come into possession of information which the other considers to be confidential, including Personal Information ("Personal Information" means information and opinions recorded in any form about an individual whose identity is apparent, or can reasonably be ascertained, from the information or opinion). Each of MEDISYNTH and B.V.D.U. contractually agrees that it shall not, at any time, disclose to any third institution, any confidential information of another institution without first having obtained the prior written consent of the other institution.
- 5.2. The provisions of this Clause 5 are intended to and shall be binding upon the institutions upon the signing of this MOU, and shall survive the termination or expiry of this MOU.

### 6. Intellectual Property

6.1. "Intellectual Property" means and includes all copyright, all rights in relation to inventions (including patent rights), plant varieties, register and unregistered trademarks, registered and unregistered designs and all other rights resulting from intellectual activity in the scientific, industrial, literary or artistic fields.

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- 6.2. Each institution shall retain all rights to existing intellectual property belonging to it and contributed by it ("Background IP") at the commencement of any Research Project arising under this Agreement.
- 6.3. If any IPR issue emerges as a result of joint research, then a specific IPR addendum will be jointly agreed upon.
- 7. Amendments and Supplementary Agreements
- 7.1. The institutions may agree to amend this MOU at any time by further memoranda in writing executed by the duly authorized officer(s) of each institution.
- 7.2. The institutions shall wherever necessary enter into written agreements to facilitate collaborative activities arising from this MOU. Such agreements will specify the details of agreed activities and programs, including the contributions and responsibilities of the institutions, funding, intellectual property provisions, confidentiality, risk allocation and indemnity obligations of each institution.
- 8. Use of Name and Logo
- 8.1. No institution shall use, nor permit any person or entity to use, the name or logo (or any variation thereof) of another institution without first obtaining prior written consent from the other institution. 
#### **Valedictory Function:**

## FOUNDATION COURSE REPORT

MBBS | PHASE 1 |2020-21

### Introduction

The foundation course has been prepared as per revised Competency based Medical Curriculum given by MCI for MBBS Phase I. The Foundation course has been devised to sensitize the learners with essential knowledge and skills which will lay a sound foundation for MBBS course. The Learning Resource material (LRM) provided by Curriculum Implementation Support Program (CISP) booklet has been used as the guideline for preparation of various modules of foundation course. A logbook is also prepared for record keeping, reflection writing and certification of completion of the foundation course.

## Planning

Planning of the Foundation Course was done through various brainstorming sessions and meetings of coordinators and subcurriculum committee members under the guidance of MEU and curriculum committee. The Time- table was drafted so as to cover all the modules and approval was taken from the concerned authorities. In view of Covid pandemic the foundation course had to be carried out in a shorter time frame so that it would also cover important topics. The course was conducted from 2<sup>nd</sup> January to 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2021. Few topics were covered later during the routine Phase 1 teaching program as per time availability and convenience, also during after hours.

## Execution

Department of Anatomy was responsible for the smooth execution of the foundation course. Dr.Nitin Mudiraj, Dr.Priya Patil and Dr.Yogita Kamble were incharge of this task. The time table of the foundation course was circulated to all the concerned faculty and resource persons. The time table was uploaded on the website as well as on whatsapp group of students and parents. The venue was conveyed to the students a day prior to the schedule.

## **Faculty**

- In house Faculty: Total 42 Faculties from pre, para & clinical subjects were
  involved in this program. They were sensitized appropriately for conducting their
  sessions by conducting meetings. During these meetings faculties were made
  aware of the requirements of session, use of appropriate TL methods & use of
  media. Resources were provided whenever they were in need or whenever we
  received from Nodal centre or MCI.
- External Faculty: Four external faculties were invited for conducting the sessions as given below
  - a. Dr.Pooja Narwadkar talked on Sexual harassment at Workplace & Prevention of Sexual Harassment Law.
  - b. Yoga & Meditation was conducted by a team comprising of 2 trainers from Harshad Gadgil, B.E. Civil, Yog Shikshak and Pranav Kulkarni M.Sc. Biotech., Yog Shikshak from Vishwa Yoga Darshan Kendra, Sangli.
  - c. Mr. Y.P. Kulkarni, resource person for language sessions.

## **Report on Orientation Program**

The orientation program was conducted on the first day of the foundation course. It included various topics like the Academic ambience, Overview of MBBS Programme, University rules regarding examinations & attendance, Introduction to Foster –parent system Interaction with parents (Question-answers), Information regarding Anti- Ragging campaign and Ragging-free campus which gave a brief idea to the students and parents about the MBBS course. Dean's address to students and parents also highlighted the duties and responsibilities of the students when they are in this campus. Dean sir also interacted with the parents and solved any query that they had in mind.

## Report on Skill Module

## A. Practical demonstration of Proper Hand wash, gloving and degloving-

i. Interactive sessions were taken by the department of Community Medicine initially emphasising proper hand washing and types of hand washing. Importance of hand washing for healthcare givers & risk associated with improper hand washing and transmission of infections.

ii. Steps of hand washing and gloving and de-gloving video was shown followed by actual demonstration of proper techniques.

iii. A batch of 50 students was divided in a group of 10 each and hands on training with provision of separate basin with running tap water and soap was given and asked individually to demonstrate Hand wash followed by gloving and degloving.

iv. Prepared Checklist was used for step by step observation till satisfactory result.

## B. Report on First Aid Session:

Power point presentation was given to explain the topic. Students were divided in small groups for DOAP sessions. The sessions were conducted by Department of Surgery and co-ordinated by department of Anatomy.

## C. Report on Basic Life Support:

The sessions were conducted by department of Physiology. The students were sensitised to the topic through power point presentations. Later the practical aspect was explained through DOAP.

## D. Report on Bio- Medical waste:

Concept of Biomedical waste was explained with the help of power point presentation.

Different types of waste, colour coding for segregation, various types of final disposal techniques were explained. Students were allowed to use their logic for categorising waste.

Lecture was followed by DOAP session. Workstation consisting of colour coded charts were placed. Bio-medical waste items were placed in a tray. Each student was called upon and asked to place the BMW on right colour coded charts. The competency was assessed by observing and using a check list.

E. Report on Cultural Competency: Session began with taking the pledge of India. Then 16 symbols related to different cultures were focused on the screen and the students were asked to identify them.

Differences between cultures and religions were described giving examples.

What includes culture, benefits of culture, how to understand cultures? What is the importance of cultural differences? Why is cultural identity Important? What shapes cultures?

The meaning of cultural competence was later derived from the students. The elements and benefits of cultural competence were discussed.

## F. Report on Disability Competency:

With the help of PPT presentation on Disability, definition, rights of the disabled person - UN and WHO guidelines as well as the vision of the disability was discussed with the students.

Social environmental hurdles in day-to-day life of the disabled person were discussed. Role of rehabilitation team and different rehabilitation modes were explained.

## Report on Professional development & Ethics

To enhance the importance of values such as Professionalism, attitude & ethical behavior, the students were sensitized initially through power point presentation followed by role play by faculty and students. Following topics were covered during the sessions:

- a) Concept of professionalism & ethics
- b) Value of integrity, honesty & respect during interaction with peers, seniors & faculty other health care workers & patients
  The students enthusiastically participated in the sessions. They were told to do reflection writing after the sessions.

## **Report on Pandemic Module**

In view of the COVID 19 Pandemic, this module was introduced in the foundation course. The students were made aware of the prevailing pandemic, signs and symptoms, treatment protocols, safety measures etc through power point presentation.

## **Report on Computer Skills Sessions**

All the students were divided into two batches. One batch 'A' was for learning Language while other batch 'B' was for Computer skill learning. Objectives: 1. To learn basic skills in Microsoft Office, power point presentation & its Applications 2. To apply the skills of Microsoft Office & power point Applications for preparing reports/presentations. 3. To learn reference searching 4. To learn digital applications like Google classroom, Whatsapp, Email. The students were made aware of different features of Microsoft word, power point and excel. They were given tasks individually as well as in groups. Assignments were given to students.

## Report on Language Skill Session

All the students were divided into two batches. One batch 'A' was for learning Language while other batch 'B' was for Computer skill learning. We identified the students who wanted to learn Marathi & those who wanted to learn English. The non Marathi students were more in number for Marathi learning, while very few students wanted to learn English.

All the sessions were organized as per different modules developed by faculty and two assessments were conducted.

## **Feedback on Foundation Course**

All the students were instructed to give feedback on every session. The feedback was collected online through Google forms and analysed.

The feedback was taken at the end of each day's session. The questions were based on following points:

- 1. Content of the session
- 2. Delivery of the session
- 3. Usefulness of the session
- 4. Technical aspects
- 5. What did you like most and what needs to be changed?

The feedback was taken as per grading on a scale of 0 to 3 (0=needs improvement, 1=average, 2=good, 3=excellent)

The feedback was analysed as per different modules of Foundation course as follows:

- 3. To share strategies adopted to gain confidence in delivering virtual remote lectures.



## College self-study report (about 5-10 pages):

Describing the current state of their efforts to improve student learning and the academic quality of their programs

Poona College of Pharmacy has adopted the B. Pharm syllabus as per the mandatory recommendations of PCI since academic year 2019-2020. For the current Academic Year (CAY), PCI syllabus is applicable for First Year and Second Year B. Pharm., while BVDU Choice-Based Credit and Grading System (CBCS) 2015 is applicable for Third Year and Final year B. Pharm. The B. Pharm course is of four-year duration and the syllabus structure is based on choice based credit system. The CBCS adopts continuous assesemnt methodology which includes internal sessional exams, assignments, project work, end semester University examinations and includes four weeks of industrial training. The syllabus content of each subject is designed based on the Program Outcomes (POs) envisaged by NBA. The contents of each theory and practical subject are well defined based on the Course Outcomes (COs) and for the practicals the focus is on skill development in the field of pharmaceutical sciences as per the syllabus. Content delivery of the syllabus is accomplished using apt teaching-learning methodologies, so as to further strengthen the course outcomes (COs), program educational objectives (PEOs) and program outcomes (POs).

The dedicated faculty members have taken lot of efforts to improve students learning in various ways. For instance, for each course, a course file is prepared by the respective faculty in which all details of students performance in class test, assignments, sessional exam and university exams, result analysis, students assessment, semester plan etc are maintained. The curriculam gaps are identified by different mechanisms such as feedback received from the stake holders which helps to identify the curricular gaps. Based on the feedback the APC recommends the corrective measures for the same. The corrective measures include the extra

inputs from faculty as well as the guest lectures on topics beyond syllabus. In accordance to the suggestions received from the stakeholders, faculty and students, during routine feedback, activities were conducted for delivery of content beyond syllabus. The students are informed and encouraged to enrol for various MOOCs on UGC SWAYAM portal. Bharati Vidyapeeth has collaborated with EDX which is a nonprofit online learning destination and MOOC platform, founded by Harvard University, USA and The Massachusetts Institute of Technology, USA. As a part of this collaboration students from Bharati Viyapeeth could enrol for various courses and receive certification after course completion.

### **Teaching Learning Process Overview:**

The Institute has well defined teaching learning and evaluation approach which is as follows




Figure 2.8: Teaching Learning Process

### **Teaching Learning Plan**

- At the beginning of each session an the institutional academic calendar and institutional annual calendar consisting of commencement of session, holidays, events, sessional examination, practical examination, preparation leave and end semester examination is prepared on the basis of calendar issued by BVDU. The details are notified and sent as circular to the teaching, non-teaching staff and students.
- Subject-wise workload is distributed to faculty. Department wise workload
  distribution is prepared and submitted by HOD to the In-Charge of Academic
  Programme Committee (APC) for preparation of Time Table.
- Individual Faculty prepares academic plan after the syllabus allocation.
- At the beginning of the session, one week orientation/ induction programme is conducted for the First year B. Pharm. students to introduce with basic concepts, fundamentals and scope of pharmacy programme. Also, the overview of the college infrastructure, importance of different departments of the Institute and the different co-curricular and extracurricular activities conducted is given to the students.
- Regular classes and practicals are conducted as per time-table and teaching program is started as notified by BVDU.
- Assignments, Tutorials and Group presentations are conducted for all students in each subject regularly.
- If any faculty is on leave, another faculty engages the class which ensures continuation of classes.

- Difficulties in any subject are solved by arranging extra classes in zero hour, as per the need.
- Students are encouraged and guided to participate in various curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities to ensure their all-round development.
- Academic related notifications and study materials are shared with students via e-Learning Environment of Bharati Vidyapeeth (Deemed to be University)
   [http://ele.bvuict.in/ele/course/view.php?id=618] and also through the MS Teams portal of BVDU.
- The focus of the B. Pharm program is on adequate skill development hence practicals are an important component of the curriculum.
  - o Curriculum in all semesters has laboratory work.
  - o Every laboratory has Faculty in Charge, Lab attendant and lab assistant.
  - o Students carry out the experiments as prescribed in the syllabus
  - Each laboratory has appropriate facilities i.e., workspace, equipment, glassware, chemicals, first aid kits, fire extinguishers along with SOPs, safety instructions, laboratory manuals and log books.
  - For each experiment detailed instructions and explanation are provided to the students.
  - The observations are checked and verified by the faculty and lab records are maintained systematically.

### Various instructional methods and pedagogical initiatives used in teaching

### • <u>Lectures/Presentations:</u>

Lectures/ classroom teaching are the effective way of achieving the program outcomes (POs) and course outcomes (COs). The course outcomes could not be better achieved without classroom teaching. Every classroom is equipped with PC, LCD

projector and wi-fi facility. Lectures are the means to convey facts, make students think, analyse and apply the concepts. The teacher is always available to clear the doubts instantaneously. All these efforts provide a platform to cover and improve the ability of students to solve problems. Mode of delivery of lectures is power point presentations as well as chalk and board. The course information and additional related knowledge available in the public domain—is also made available to promote learning. Interactive teaching and flip classroom techniques are adopted for classroom and online teaching.

## • Guest Lectures/Expert Talks:

In order to deliver content beyond syllabus and cover the curricular gaps guest lectures are organized regularly. Expert talks by the eminent persons from pharmaceutical industries, research organization/ practicing pharmacists help the students as well faculty to understand current trends in various domains, which further leads to the attainment of POs. External resource persons also add value to the program and help students to link education and real world in the profession. These talks act as a bridge to fill the curricular gaps and also develop rapport for meeting the future needs of the industries /research organization / universities. This promotes the habit of life-long learning.

#### • Project-based learning:

In the 8th semester, projects are alotted to the students. They receive guidance from faculty on individual level. Students need to submit a project report/thesis of the work for assessment and have to present their work. This also helps to develop self learning, problem solving abilities, creative and innovative thinking as well as presentation skills.

### • Collaborative Learning:

Seminars, debates, group discussions, practical classes, tutorials and case-based studies are organized to cultivate the culture of collaborative learning as well as team working.

### • Educational/Industrial Visit:

Visit to research organizations and pharmaceutical industries help to explore all opportunities and have greater impact on the students. These allow the students to make real-life decisions. These visits help in career exploration, decision making and to become life-long learners.

### • Seminars:

Seminar serve as a platform for sharing knowledge/expertise in advanced areas, which results in collaboration and attempt for enhancement of the overall personality; Students also develop skills like public speaking, presentation skill and self confidence. The communication skills can also help the students who are interested to work as a practicing pharmacist.

### • **Induction program:**

The Institute organizes one week orientation/ induction programs as a first step to introduce the students to the institute and the program. As a part of this exercise, the institute also conducts workshops which help in developing self-learning as well as lifelong learning. Experts from pharma industry, IT, community pharmacy and academia guide and orient the students on various aspects of pharmacy. Our alumni are also actively involved in this process.

### **Infrastructure:**

• The college has well planned building and infrastructure wherein the Research Wing is attached to the UG section through Capsule Bridge is unique feature. Research

- wing, in its area of 45000 sq. ft. standing with 5 floors containing about 29 laboratories, 5 interactive cells and ultramodern equipments of about five crores is only one example of institution attached research facility in the country. The displays and walls are the showcase of the research publications.
- The College houses spacious, well laid out, well equipped and well maintained laboratories for different branches of Pharmacy viz. Pharmaceutics, Pharmaceutical and Medicinal Chemistry, Pharmaceutical Analysis, Pharmacology, Pharmacognosy and Natural Products, Quality Assurance, Microbiology, Computer Education, Industrial Pharmacy, Tissue Culture, Computer Aided Drug Design and Polymer Research. We have provided separate laboratories for the post-graduate students of all the five branches that is Pharmaceutics, Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Pharmacology, Pharmacognosy, Quality Assurance Techniques and Biotechnology. All these laboratories have the necessary and latest instruments and equipments. The undergraduate students have been provided with separate laboratories which are also equipped with all the required instruments.
- Our laboratories are equipped to the level of international standards and norms (and thus have set an example for others.) A separate analytical instrument room has been provided which houses sophisticated and ultramodern instruments like Ultraviolet Spectrophotometer, Fourier Transform Infra Red Spectrophotometer, Atomic Chromatograph, Absorption Spectrometer, Gas High Performance Liquid Chromatograph, SCFC, TGA, PCR, Cryocentrifuge, High Performance Thin Layer Chromatograph, Differential Scanning Calorimeter, Spectrofluorimeter etc. Dissolution Test Apparatus, Ultrasonicator, Polarising Microscope are available in the Pharmaceutics research laboratory. Pharmacology research laboratory has instruments like Plethysmometer, Analgesimeter, Polygraph while Pharmacognosy research

laboratory has facilities for plant tissue culture, sohxlet extractors, etc. Rarely one would find such an updated and sophisticated equipment elsewhere in any other Pharmacy College. All these facilities have been created for the use of undergraduate as well as post-graduate students, research scholars and the faculty members.

- Pharma Museum created by the college is decorated with historical procedures and processes of manufacturing medicines, traditional practice of treating diseases along with modern examples of pharmaceutical innovations and technology.
- The institution has adequate number of rooms for Lectures, Seminars, Tutorials etc. for the B.Pharm. course being taught in the college. The Lecture rooms/Halls are also well furnished for the capacity of seventy students or more with sufficient space to move in and out. Moreover the Rooms/Halls for Lectures/Seminars/Tutorials are also well equipped with teaching aids such as OHP, LCD projectors, PA system. The class rooms also have CCTV facilities.
- Sufficient numbers of laboratories are available for B. Pharm students, funded projects, M. Pharm, Ph.D. work, PTL etc. for performing their practicals and carrying out research work. The labs are available after working hours on week days and also on holidays with prior permission of the Lab. Incharge, Head of the department and Security Officer.
- In addition to academic infrastructure college has in house set up of Public testing laboratory approved by FDA, Maharashtra to cater the need of industries in and around Pune, a pilot plant of manufacturing unit established as per GMP and NABL accredited centre for food testing laboratory.

### Research- publications, projects in brief

The different areas in which research work is undertaken in this College are: Novel drug delivery systems, development of biodegradable polymers, floating tablets, formulation

development etc in the department of Pharmaceutics; Simultaneous estimation of multicomponent formulations by HPLC, HPTLC and UV-VIS spectrophotometer; Herb drug interactions, Exploring neuroprotective agents from natural sources, isolation of phytoconsituents from plants and synthesis and Pharmacological activity of new molecules in the department of Pharmaceutical Chemistry; Screening of traditional formulations and plant extracts for neurodegeneration, CNS, CVS activities, anti-inflammatory, anti arthritic studies, pharmacokinetic studies and toxicity studies etc. in Pharmacology; Herbal drug standardisation, Wound healing formulation, Plant tissue culture techniques, Isolation and studies on Gums of natural origin etc. in Pharmacognosy, Validations of instruments, equipments and tablet, granulation, mixing, coating machinery etc. in Quality Assurance Techniques.

The students and faculty members regularly publish research papers in the journals of national and international repute. This is evidenced by the number of publications they have got to their credit. They have published about 180 research papers in national and international journals in the last three academic years. Faculty have received projects worth of Rs. 22,315,373 from Govt agencies and Rs. 11,614,173 from Industries.


Name of Activity: INDUCTION PROGRAM- B. PHARM FIRST YEAR (Batch- 2020-21)

#### **College self-study report:**

## 1. Describing the current state of their efforts to improve student learning and the academic quality of their programs.

Education programs focus on bettering student achievements. A good, high-quality education is to do with outcomes. An outcome is a culminating demonstration of learning. It occurs after the completion of the academic program. It is a result of learning, which is a visible and observable demonstration of three main things - knowledge, combined with competence, combined with orientations. It is these three factors that determine the quality in higher education.

#### **Curriculum Design:**

The syllabus and course structure of Engineering Programs are revised periodically. Since the inception of BVUCOE, Pune as a constituent unit (2000), the course structure and syllabi of Engineering Programs was revised in 2004, 2007, 2011 and 2014.

Salient Features of the new curriculum:

- Emphasis on continuous assessment with weightage to the extent of 40 per cent.
- Scope for student's creativity is given. Assessment of the students based on his performance in preparing new laboratory experiments, presentations, assignments, and real-life problems.
- Addressing employability by way of introducing In-plant training (45 days) as an integrated part of the course structure.
- Professional Skill Development is a new subject added from the first year to the third year in which all soft skills, analytical skills, interview techniques, communication skill, aptitude test preparation, preparing a CV, Group Discussions etc. will be taught. This will expose the student to a wider scope for his placement.
- To inculcate learning attitude among students, two Self Study Papers are introduced for PG programs. Students have a choice to select Self Study Papers that of other disciplines also.
- Wide choice of elective subjects for students.
- Execution of project/dissertation works in two stages viz. Stage I for literature review and crystalizing the idea/concept and Stage II for experimentation and analysis of results.
- The curriculum comprises of core courses, interdisciplinary and computational courses, and electives.
- CBCS for UG as well as PG programs are following AICTE, New Delhi.
- Assessment of Term work is based on understanding, presentation, and timely submission.
- Introduced NPTEL curriculum-based videos as part of term work.
- Industry visits, series of guest lectures are integrated part of the course structure.

#### **Continuous Assignments**





Subject-wise separate assignments to all students are introduced in a new format. This improves the ability of students to solve and enhance their skills for that subject and regular assessment by the faculties during the entire semester makes them study continuously and score well in their final semester examinations. These assignments are given by subject teacher batch-wise, individually and in other ways. It covers all the six units taught in class and evaluation for the same is done individually for all the students by the faculty itself. In this assignment's students learn to perform new experiments, work on live problems. In-plant Training

The in-plant training program of 45 Days for students after Semester (VI) was introduced as an integrated part of the curriculum. The importance of this addition was to make students interact with the industry & experience problems in the industry, during their course itself. During In-plant training students writes about knowledge gained, the training he received, the technology he experienced and interaction with managerial and technical personnel. He maintains a separate logbook for the same. He is assessed on the same. All the students are employed for the training program since it has been introduced. The details for the number of students attended for the last two academic year are 688 and 635 respectively. Virtual Lab

This new concept of Virtual lab an initiative of Ministry of H.R.D was introduced to the faculty members and students. It has been designed to improve remote access to labs and is used to complement physical labs. Virtual labs enable the students to perform experiments remotely as an on-demand service on the web. It provides a complete learning management system that includes web-resources, video lectures, animated demonstrations, and self-evaluation. Virtual labs enable the students to learn at their own pace and to arouse their curiosity. Students of Semester IV and VI were made attend the workshop arranged for the same. in-Pods

in-Pod is a portable software platform; it can take learning beyond the boundaries of the classroom. Its fit-in-your-pocket ease, offers anytime, anywhere opportunities for teaching and learning. With the creative support of i-Life, it can help foster students' information, visual, and media literacies. It enables teachers to promote collaborative, independent, and differentiated learning, adapting to the needs of each learner. As a professional development tool, it expands opportunities teachers have to strengthen their understanding of the subjects they teach and widen the repertoire of the instructional strategies they use. It is inexpensive relative to laptop and desktop computers. Much of the educational potency of in-Pod stems from its integrated nature. Whether functioning as an audio and video player that delivers compelling rich media or as a device that stores and transports student-produced content. Together, these tools can support the development of a wide range of student skills and teaching strategies. And describing how in-pod functionality supports these skills and strategies is the aim of this software.

#### Saturday at Bharati Vidyapeeth

This program intends to be the mentoring of students. In this program, speakers are entrepreneurs and high ranked corporates share their experiences, hardships & how they survived various industrial/managerial crises during their journey. This, in turn, enriches the student with various

Clearing Aptitude Test is a very Important facet and preliminary requirement by all MNC's and Core Companies. The College has designed "Employment Enhancement Program" (EEP) for all Third Year Students.

#### 4. Citing and briefly describing documentation supporting exemplary practices

Academic Record Book of the faculty members: A record book mainly contains academic detail of student viz. attendance, continuous assessment for laboratory/term work, etc. Further, it also provides information about the performance of faculty member with respect to research and development, academics, seminar/workshop/conferences attended, etc. Vision and mission statements are written in Academic Record Book of the faculty members. Faculty members must enter planning of lectures, practical for the course he is teaching. It is checked and monitored by HOD and academic committee regularly.

#### Assignments:

Assignments are given for all the courses and for all the students on online MS Teams platform. Assessment of assignments is also done online, and students can view their performance. Record of this activity is maintained and accessed online.

Guest Lectures



Guest lectures are arranged by department and CESA to explore students about latest knowledge. For this various eminent personality from Industry are called to deliver lecture. Record of this practice—Invitation letter, Attendance, and photographs — is maintained properly.

#### o In-plant Training

In plant training is aimed at giving students a first-hand experience in the professional environment. In this students are sent for industrial training for 45 days period. During this they are getting hands on experience on live construction projects. Students are expected to participate in the daily working of the company/ organization assigned. Students are expected to learn latest technologies, methodologies, concepts being implemented in the company. Students write daily report of their assignment and get it duly signed by the concerned person in the company. Finally, students undergo a vivavoce examination on the in plant training at the end of semester. Record of this practice—Request letter to company, Logbook — is maintained properly.

#### o CESA

In the department, CESA (Civil Engineering Student Association) is a active student association which arranges technical event in the department at time of BHARATIYAM (Annual Tech Fest) and other programs throughout the year. 



#### **Executive Summary of Self-Study Report**

#### CRITERION-I: CURRICULAR ASPECTS

#### 1.1. Curriculum Design and Development

Inclusion of new developments in the subject, updation of the curriculum is one of the important needs of modern teaching. During the period under consideration, curriculum was revised and changed from annual to semester pattern and upgraded to choice based credit and grade system. Revision of syllabus through boards of studies is done every year and the course is usually changed after every three years. Being a constituent unit of the university, the faculty members get an opportunity to contribute in curriculum design and development. During last five years, the faculty members have contributed on various academic bodies like Board of Management, Academic council, faculty and board of studies.

#### 1.2. Academic Flexibility

To fulfill the demands of the students the college offers academic flexibility to students of first year to opt either Diploma in Banking or Diploma in Marketing along with Degree Courses as well as UGC sponsored certificate courses. For last three years 347 students have opted for Diploma in Banking and 51 students for Diploma in Marketing. Multiple options are available for specialization at the Under-Graduate & Post-Graduate level. Any graduate is eligible for admission to M.A and M.Com courses. Horizontal Mobility is permissible in most of the programmes.

#### 1.3. Curriculum Enrichment

For improvement of the curriculum, the curriculum is designed in such a manner that several desirable features mentioned can be inculcated among the students like value systems, global competencies, use of technology, national development, creativity and quest for excellence. The advances in the respective disciplines, industry-institute interactions, opinions of academic experts and faculty interaction with academic bodies of other universities have constructively contributed in curriculum enhancement.

#### 1.4. Feedback System

Feedback is sought from several stake holders for the design and development of new courses and revision of the existing courses. The interaction with the stakeholders, industry requirement, job potential and academic enrichment are taken into consideration for revision of curriculum. The introduction of new course - M.Sc. Organic Chemistry is the outcome of such an endeavor. In addition, the courses were redesigned in 2012, 2014 and 2016 taking into consideration the feedback received from stakeholders.

#### CRITERION-II: TEACHING- LEARNING AND EVALUATION

#### 2.1. Student Enrolment and Profile

The norms and policies of the university and government of Maharashtra are meticulously followed during admission. The information about admission is given wide publicity through local and regional newspapers, university and college website and education partner, Shiksha dot com. Fee structure is approved by the university, state government and fee fixation committee. For the most of the classes, the college follows first come first served principle. The alumni of the college strongly recommend the prospective *Yashwants* to seek admission in the college. We admit the students irrespective of gender, cast, creed and religion and special attention is also given to the weaker sections. It is noteworthy to mention that the overall enrollment of students increased from 1518 in 2011-12 to 1836 in 2019-20. The girl students' enrollment has increased from 37% in 2011-12 to 38.56% in 2019-20. Not only this but also the enrollment under minority section stands at 32.67% with respect to total number students admitted.

The college facilitates National and state Merit Scholarships, central and state government free ships, Bharati Vidyapeeth fee concessions as well as scholarships offered by other non-governmental organizations.

#### 2.2. Catering to Student Diversity

The overall student's enrolment has shown consistent growth. Presently, there are 133 students from other states and Union Territories, 91 international students along with 1612 students form Maharashtra perusing higher studies in the college. Our college is a home away from home for international students. The college is the most preferred destination especially for International students. Presently, 83 boys and 8 girls from 8 countries are pursuing higher studies in the college. Enrollment from almost 23 states of India has helped to imbibe multicultural environment, thus achieving national integration.

Due to inclusivity maintained on the campus, there is also consistent growth of SC/ST and OBC students.

#### 2.3. Teaching-Learning Process

Teaching-Learning Process is the backbone of any educational system. The academic calendar is prepared and followed meticulously throughout the year. The calendar is notified to the student and staff members in the beginning of every year. The preparation and monitored implementation of teaching plan has helped to improve the attendance of the students as well as delivery of the knowledge.

The college library provides text books, reference books, journals and e-resources. Along with this, the teaching faculty make use of e-lectures, you tube demonstrations, DIGIFROG, BLAST (Basic Local Alignment search Tool) to enhance the teaching activity. Even the ICT-learning environment complements the classroom teaching.

Industrial visits and the internship have helped to inculcate lifelong learning skill as well as the inclusion of research projects has proved beneficial to enhance the scientific temperament among the students.

The faculty members as well as the students are exposed to advanced level of knowledge and skills through organization and participation in national and international knowledge events and interaction with research scholars and experts. Effective use of Enterprise Resource Planning system has channelized the student-teacher relationship in digitized manner.

#### 2.4. Teacher Quality

Teacher Quality is an important parameter in delivery of knowledge. We follow the rules and regulations of UGC, Govt. of Maharashtra and Bharati Vidyapeeth Deemed University, Pune for the recruitments, service conditions and the pay scales. At present, there are 34 full time faculty members. 29 faculty members are Ph.D. holders as their highest qualification and 04 faculty members are pursuing their doctoral degree. 13 faculty members are recognized research guides. In addition, the faculty members have attended 04 refresher, one faculty member has completed Arpit course and 25 FDPs were attended by our faculty members during the last three years. Feedback from the students on curriculum and the teaching faculty is a regular practice. The teaching and non-teaching staff is assessed through Performance Based Appraisal System forms and Self-Appraisal forms respectively.

During last three years, the faculty members have participated in 33 international, 145 national Knowledge events and published 52 research papers. Some of them have attended international conferences in USA, Scotland, Costa Rica, Oman, Canada, Iran, Malaysia, South Korea, France, Sri Lanka etc. In an attempt to improve the quality of knowledge, the college organized 6 national Knowledge events during last three years.

#### 2.5. Evaluation Process and Reforms

The internal assessment weightage 80:20 in annual system is changed to 60:40 in the CBCS semester Programmes. Industrial internship, long term papers, field visits etc. are some of the major evaluation reforms introduced by the college. The college promotes the use of ICT teaching-learning process. The internal evaluation is conducted through ICT enabled

examinations like on-line MCQ tests. Provision is available to resolve the grievances of the students through grievance redressal cell.

#### 2.6. Student Performance and Learning Outcomes

The College has institutionalized the teaching-learning and evaluation process to achieve the learning outcomes. The examination results are always above 60% thereby maintaining good academic standards. Rigorous efforts are made to instill a set of core values like higher competency in the discipline, independent and critical thinking, adaptation to cultural diversity and international environment, social and ethical commitment and team work among the students by challenging the students through activities like knowledge events, use of ICT, research projects, internship, NSS forum, sports events, annual social gathering Sanskriti and college magazine Yashobharati. The graduate attributes are also framed in tune with the goals and objectives of the college.

#### CRITERION-III: RESEARCH, CONSULTANCY AND EXTENSION

#### 3.1. Promotion of Research

Research is one of the basics for the survival of any academic institution in the contemporary world. The college is a recognized research centre of the university. There are 34 students currently registered for Ph.D. in college research center. Adequate research infrastructure is provided to promote research attitude among the faculty and the students. IQAC and research committee of the college monitor the research activities. Faculty is encouraged to submit research proposal to various funding agencies. The outcome of which is, 19 major and 12 minor research projects are completed till date. The faculty members have to their credit 05 approved, 04 published and 1 filled patents.

During the last three years, 56 papers are published in reputed journals. Even 49 students have presented their research papers in conferences. During last three years, 470 projects were completed by the students.

To maintain the research environment, eminent scientists, researchers and entrepreneurs are invited for interaction with students and the faculty members. More than 300 such personalities visited the college during last three years.

#### 3.2. Resource Mobilization for Research

Grant of Rs. 52,50,000 was received under DST-FIST for development of infrastructure for research. The faculty members have also received travel grants worth Rs. 4,58,542/- from UGC and the university to attend international knowledge events abroad.

#### 3.3. Research Facilities

The college procures maximum research funding from the various funding agencies and adequate provision is also made for research promotion in institutional budget. A separate building 'Vigyan Sanshodhan Bhavan' in-house all science laboratories. The research laboratories are well equipped with modern instruments such as X-Ray Diffractometer, Gas Chromatography, FTIR, UV-Visible spectrophotometer, ultrasonic spray system and others. Library has a rich collection of references in the form of print and e-resources. Staff members and the scholars have access to Scopus and Web of Science Indexed Journals Databases. Urkund anti-plagiarism software has proved to be a boon to original research.

#### 3.4. Research Publications and Awards

Promotion of research is one of the best practices followed by the college. Adequate research infrastructure is provided and required technical support is also made available to the researchers. The outcome of this is visible in the quality research publications. They are given financial support for publishing papers and filing patents. The total publications in the calendar years from 2018 to 2020 are 56. Out of which, 47 are international, 05 national and which includes 16 Scopus, 32 Indian citation indexed and 04 web of science publications and all are included in the Google scholar index. During the period under consideration, the total number of books authored by the faculty members is 3. So far, thirty eight of the faculty members have bagged best researcher award, outstanding researcher and exemplary contribution award. Apart from this, 08 faculty members are contributing on editorial boards of various international refereed journals. Our faculty members also publish two peer reviewed international journals.

The quality of the research publications by our faculty members includes publications in UGC CARE listed journals and refereed journals. In addition, cumulative citations of the college is 2693 with i10 index 55 and h-index is 30.

#### 3.5. Consultancy

The extension of the research activity done by the faculty members has contributed to the development of the society by offering consultancy in the areas of their expertise. Some consultancy services are offered free for the benefit of the society.

The department of Microbiology has been engaged in research in HIV infected individuals since 12 years. The faculty members give free consultation to the patients and provide suitable measures to improve the health condition.

The department of Chemistry provides paid service for analysis of chemicals and compounds by using FTIR and UV-Visible spectrophotometer and X-Ray Diffractometer.

#### 3.6. Extension Activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

The staff members and students are involved in various environment and pollution awareness activities, health and nutrition awareness camps, blood donation and medical camps, cleanliness drive, Police Mitra Abhiyan and gender sensitization activities.

The impact of these activities is reflected in the achievement of the students and the faculty like Best College award for NSS and Best Program Officer for NSS are grabbed by the college.

#### 3.7. Collaboration

The college has developed linkages with academic institutions, industries and research organizations. The services created by these are utilized for development and revision of curricula, completion of project work, collaborative research publications and organization of knowledge events. The outcome of these linkages is visible in completion of 470 student research projects, 49 research publications and 51 social and extension activities. Some of these linkages are converted into MOUs with industry. This includes MOUs with Speedjet Aviation, Edubridge Pvt. Ltd., Dreamz Technology Pvt Ltd, Amraotikar and Company.

### CRITERION-IV: INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

#### 4.1. Physical Facilities

The college is situated on a beautiful sprawling campus of 11 acres. There are two buildings of the college. One of these buildings is exclusively for laboratories and research namely Vigyan Sanshodhan Bhavan. The college building inhouses 17 classrooms and 22 state-of-art laboratories, Lecture capture system and sophisticated Seminar Hall along with well-equipped Gymnasium. The college building houses ICT enabled class rooms, well equipped laboratories, administrative block and gymnasium. The Botany department has maintained two botanical gardens with collection of 32 rare and endangered species of plants.

#### 4.2. Library as a Learning Resource

Library being heart of the college, maintains 46786 books, 61 print journals and access to eresources. There is a dedicated server for library services. To provide easy access to the users, OPAC service is made available through SOUL software. The college subscribes e-resources like e-books, e-journals, *shodhganga*, *shodhgangotri* etc. One lakh five thousand e-books and 12100 e-journals can be accessed through this facility. The library has signed MOUs with the sister concerned libraries on the campus for resource sharing.

During last three years, the college has spent Rs. 296187/- on reference books, textbooks, journals/periodicals, and e-books and e-journals. Separate reading facility is maintained for

students and faculty. Webpage for library is provided on college website through which students and faculty members can access to "Knowledge Resource Center" – one stop solution for online resources, question papers and newspaper readers.

#### 4.3. IT Infrastructure

The college has three state-of-art computer laboratories. There are 81 PCs, 53 Laptops, 13 printers, 11 LCDs, 5 scanners, three 15 KVA UPS to support the ICT needs of the departments, laboratories, administrative office. The college campus is made Wi-Fi enabled. Apart from this, the entire building is connected through LAN. To keep in pace with the modern teaching, Lecture Capture System was installed. Implementation of Enterprise Resource Planning and use of lecture capture system has helped us to step ahead in the digital world.

#### 4.4. Maintenance of Campus Facilities

The total budgeted amount for building, furniture and equipment, computers, garden and campus maintenance was Rs. 1,19,67,289/- during last three years.

#### CRITERION-V: STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

#### 5.1. Student Mentoring and Support

Tutor-ward system, facilities for physically disabled students, placement, Ladies Association of Yashwantrao Mohite College (LAY), college magazine, wall-paper, vocational guidance, grievance redressal cell, prevention of sexual harassment cell, anti-ragging committee, alumni association etc. proved to be helpful in the overall support to the students. A dedicated foreign students cell caters to the special need of international students thereby the college creates homely atmosphere for them.

Financial help and support is provided to deserving and needy students through offering them fee concession and the government scholarships available to them. The present slide shows that the number of students and the financial support they received during the last five years.

#### 5.2. Student Progression

Efforts taken by the college for the students is reflected through the progression of the students. There is an increasing trend for pursuing higher studies among the students. Employment opportunities are provided through campus placement. Few students go for higher studies like M. Phil. & Ph.D. Most of the students complete their graduation in stipulated time frame.

#### 5.3. Student Participation and Activities

As a positive and constructive response to the facilities provided by the college the students participate in various activities like national and international sports. During the period under consideration, 225students participated in state, national and international level competitions and received 182 medals in these competitions. More than 100 students have participated in sports events at all levels from zonal to international and won one Gold, two Silver and four Bronze medals.

To nurture the creativity of the students, the college encourages student's participation in cultural events. They are supported with required training, travel assistance and such other supports. Around 180 students have participated in cultural events from zonal to National level and have won several ranks.

As a reward to the sincere efforts and contribution of NSS unit, the college has received a Programme officer award and Best College awards during last three years. Total participation of NSS volunteers in various activities from inter collegiate to inter university level is 180 over the last three years. The discipline in individual life is always the concern of the college and NCC cadets are always ahead in it.

### CRITERION-VI: GOVERNANCE, LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT

#### 6.1. Institutional Vision and Leadership

The management along with the principal; the Principal, IQAC, various committees; heads of the department and staff members decide and execute the policies and play a major role in quality enhancement.

Faculty members are given opportunities in participating in various statutory bodies of university and contribute in various academic developments which help to develop leadership qualities. Thus, the college promotes a culture of participative management to ensure expected outcome and fulfill the vision, mission and goals/objectives of the institute.

#### 6.2. Strategy Development and Deployment

The quality policy of the college has created a benchmark in curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. The high quality standards developed through education research and other activities are put into action and monitored by the principal along with staff and students. The grievances of the stakeholders are addressed through the various committees and a healthy conducive atmosphere is maintained.

#### 6.3. Faculty Empowerment Strategies

The college is always keen to promote professional development of the faculty through expert lectures on advanced areas of subjects, team building, work and stress management,

promotion of research attitude and research projects as well as publication of research papers in reputed journals. The teaching staff is encouraged to participate in knowledge events abroad by facilitating the travel grants from the university and UGC.

#### 6.4. Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

The financial committee of the college monitors the effective and efficient use of financial resources available. The parent body and the university support the college with financial needs and requirements. The records of all these activities i.e. generation, mobilization and utilization of resources is maintained. The college has received total grants of Rs. 52,67,329/from UGC during last three years.

#### 6.5. Internal Quality Assurance System

As per NAAC directives, the college has established an IQAC cell in the year 2004. Teaching and non-teaching staff, students, management, alumni, community, Industry and external experts are actively participating and representing various stakeholders in the cell. The internal quality assurance mechanism includes the academic calendar, Time-table; ICT enabled teaching, revision of syllabuses as per the demand of industry and employers, result analysis as well as the feedback from stakeholders.

#### CRITERION-VII: INNOVATIONS AND BEST PRACTICES

#### 7.1. Environment Consciousness

The college has taken effective measures to ensure protection of environment. The measures include green audit of which is conducted with reference to tree census, classification and numbering of trees etc. Special efforts are taken to neutralize the carbon entity by supporting Bus Day, vehicle free day, PUC check up, plastic free environment drive etc.

#### 7.2. Innovations

To attain the expected outcomes of teaching-learning process, the planned activities are executed in innovative manner. These practices include implementation of CBCS for all courses, Career Orientation Courses, interdisciplinary teaching through extra credit courses, research projects, internship, promotion of rewards for excellence in teaching and research. The college also practices the rain-water harvesting. Implementation of Lecture Capture System as well as Enterprise Resource Planning is a step ahead in the digitization of teaching-learning environment. The research outputs are channelized for the benefit of the society through community oriented activities.

#### 7.3. Best Practices

Promotion of research is one of the best practices we follow. The outcome of this practice is that most of the faculty members are Ph.D. degrees holders. So far faculty members have 31 projects to the credit which have generated grants worth Rs. 1,01,27,900/-.

'To be step ahead in digitization of education' is the need of time which is achieved through lecture capture system, use of social media like YouTube, WhatsApp and Enterprise Resource Planning system.

Dedicated foreign students cell extends all the necessary support to the international students. To nurture the creativity of the students the college publishes annual number Yashobharati for the past 38 years.

Organization of National level General Knowledge test is one of the notable practices of the college since 1986. LAY, the ladies Association of the college strives hard to arrange different activities for women empowerment.






#### 'Strategic Marketing Management- During and Post COVID-19 Scenario'

Do not to take short cuts in life, focus on your strengths and do good.





Report writing on occasion of the national training day; the HEXA webinar by JCI Poona

'Developing leaders for a changing world'

The JCI group of Pune conducted an exclusive webinar on the 23rd of May for the students of our IHMCT department. It was an entire day session which was divided into two halves. The morning timings were from 10:00am to 1:00 pm where three speakers Mr. P Parmarthi, Mr. Ahmed and Miss N Shalmon spoke on topics like 'Goal setting', 'Connecting people', 'Critical thinking'. The afternoon session commenced from 4:00pm to 7:00pm. This lot had speakers MR. E Fernandes, Mr. E Upaskar and Mrs. S Maniar who spoke the topics 'Career orientation', 'Leadership' and 'Creativity'.

The first half of the day was filled with a lot of elements that acted like an eye opening experience for many of us. In the first session we were told about setting our goals and knowing our priorities, we were shown videos on young boys playing football even when they stayed on an island and had no place to play. Setting our goals on time and working on them is important, most important is putting in hard work at the right time.

Second, we had connecting people which we were shown a short video on a crime scene and expecting us to notice the changes and the mistakes in the movie. At first, everyone thought there were 5-6 mistakes, but there 21 in total. We were given examples of bisleri packaged drinking water and made aware of various fake brands that look alike to the original brands, we often tend to ignore.

Third, we were spoken about critical thinking. We were told of how to make decisions in critical situations. How to tackle our own problems. The solution to all of this was told to us that we should come up to our near ones, our family, parents and friends. Sharing problems and seeking help from them. Also, she gave an example of a situation where we have a pizza in front of us and as to how we can make decisions on whether to eat it or not. Basically, all the speaker tried to explain was to make firm decisions.



Then begun the second half of the webinar at 4:00pm. The fourth session was conducted on ne topic career orientation. The speaker begun with asking a few general knowledge questions. Students showed active participation by answering to those questions in the chat box. He showed us a presentation on career orientation. The slides included of topics like, What is a career?', 'Is deciding career important?', 'What time to decide a career?' and so on. He gave us a few steps to follow which included self assessment, explore and research, lecision making and taking action. His session ended with lines that said 'failing to plan is planning to fail'. He also spoke of his native town goa and he lacked internet due to poor weather. Hence we lost him because of poor connection.

The fifth session was conducted by a lawyer by profession. He too interacted with students through question answer session. He asked us to apologize to the paper and see if they joined again. It didn't! he basically tried to explain that a leader has to have faith in his employee or follower and guide him/her when in need.

And finally, the sixth and the last session of the day was conducted on the topic creativity. The speaker spoke of her background and how she grew up in the city of Pune, her schooling and her days back in college. She begun her presentation with a birthday party set up and asked us to get creative with just a piece paper. 
