- Changes to UG curriculum are done by introducing new topics in the field of medicine.
- Revision of question paper pattern of PG courses in medical sciences at University Examinations.
- Ph.D. entrance examination syllabus has been revised.
- Syllabi of the pre Ph.D. courses have been revised.
- In view of implementation of CBCS pattern, the preparation of structure and syllabus of B.Pharm programme is in progress. It will be implemented from 2015-16.
- Introduction of In-plant training (45 days) as a part of course structure of UG programmes in Engineering.
- Professional Skill Development is added as a new subject in the first 3 years of the engineering programme in which topics such as soft skills, analytical skills, interview techniques, communication skill, aptitude test preparation, preparing a CV, group discussions etc. are taught.
- Two Self Study courses are introduced at PG level in engineering faculty.
- Value addition courses and Para legal courses are introduced in the faculty of law.
- An interdisciplinary Ph.D. programme in Pharmacy and Law (Forensic sciences) is introduced.
- Syllabi of semester programmes in arts, science and commerce are revised and implemented.
- Dual specialization with the focus on industry needs is introduced in the MBA programme.
- Syllabus for integrated five year MCA programme has been prepared.
- Syllabus of B.P.Ed programme was revised and the duration of the course is now converted to two years from one year.

- In Medical faculty 6 new departments, namely, Speciality department of Emergency Medicine and Super speciality departments of Neonatology, Paediatric Surgery, Critical Care, Cardiology and Urosurgery have been established at Medical College, Pune.
- A Cardiology, Nephrology and Trauma care centre was established at Medical College and Hospital, Sangli.
- Bioacoustics centre was started to study bat acoustics and bird acoustics at Institute of Environment Education and Research, Pune.
- Cyber Legal Aid Centre and E-Learning, E-Litigation, E-Justice Centre are established at New Law College, Pune.
- New Centre of Indian Council of Agriculture Research (ICAR) is established at IRSHA, Pune.

3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

All the constituent units of the University have undertaken multiple extension activities. More important extension and institutional social responsibility activities conducted by various constituent units are given below:

- Total 362 activities were organized by the Medical College, Pune as a part of extension activities, which includes health check-up camps, diagnostic camps, health education lectures, woman's health etc., vaccination camps, spirometry camps, anganwadi students health check-up, tree plantation drive, tubectomy, cataract, DBCS school health check-up, mid life health check-up camp, public private partnership-ZP health check-up camps, vision screening camp, hearing check-up camps etc.
- Faculty have written articles in various local newspapers and magazines to create public awareness about the speech and hearing disorders.
- NSS Unit has organized 24 winter camps with the participation various constituent units. 493 boys and 393 girls have participated in the winter camps. Activities such as, road repairing, tree plantation, cleanliness drive, women health check-up, road safety drive, mahila bachat gat melava, computer literacy etc. were conducted.
- 27 medical camps in rural area were organized by Medical College and Hospital, Sangli. 36 visits were made to rural health centres for health checkup.
- Dental College and Hospital, Pune has organized a total 41 dental check-up camps in rural areas as well as for physically and mentally challenged children. Around 400 children from Poona Blind School, Koregaon Park and Savali, an association for handicapped and mentally challenged childrens, were benefitted.
- Health check up camps at Orphanages were organized by College of Ayurved, Pune.

- Breast Feeding Week, World AIDS Day, World Leprosy Day, World Cancer Day, World TB Day, WHO Day, International Women’s Day were celebrated for creating awareness among the society by College of Nursing, Pune. Students of this college have also participated in Pulse Polio Programme as well as International Marathon event.
- College of Nursing, Sangli has organized a poster exhibition on Ebola Virus, Gastro and dengue in selected schools of Sangli, Miraj and Kupwad corporation area.
- Poona College of Pharmacy, Pune has organized Hemoglobin Check-up, Anemia Detection and Counselling Camp for girls at Shankarrao More Vidyalaya and Subbarao Kadam Junior College, Pune and Medical Health Check-up camp for PMC staff at Katraj, Pune.
- State level campaign through National Green Corps programme to create awareness for celebrating festivals in an eco-friendly way was organized by the Institute of Environment Education and Research, Pune. Further, Tree plantation programmes are organized by the institute, in each village where an NGC school is located.
- Activities such as Women Empowerment Programme, Drive for re-use of waste Paper, Swacha Bharat Abhiyan, Eye Donation Camp and Health awareness programme were conducted by the College of Engineering, Pune.
- New Law College has undertaken activities such as PIL and Legal Literacy Camp, Free Legal Aid Advice : Matrimonial Disputes resolved, Human Rights Protection and Participation in Maha-Lokadalat.
- Yashwantrao Mohite College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Pune have conducted activities such as Police mitra abhiyan, Bio waste Disposal Awareness and creation of Vermicomposting facility.
- IRSHA has organized three Omega-3 supplementation program in Knee Osteoarthritis at senior citizen club, 09 Multi-Specialty camps for Osteoarthritis, Cancer, Obesity and Diabetes. The institute has also surveyed 3325 women to find out the prevalence of cervicitis.
- Institute of Management and Rural Development Administration, Sangli has organized a ‘Girls Self-Defence Programme’ and ‘Gyan Bharati’ A National Level Book Exhibition.
- Some of the major activities conducted by the Institute of Management, Kolhapur include ‘Adoption of 32 old age persons and Computer Literacy Movement in village Kanerimath through NSS students. Lso. The institute has participated in Guinness World Record activity - ‘Bharat Natyam Mega Show’ held at Kolhapur,
- A Paper Bag Marketing activity and Swacchata Abhiyan at Pandharpur were organized by Abhijit Kadam Institute of Management and Social Sciences, Solapur in collaboration with Social Welfare Department at Solapur. Further, the institute has organised “DISHA” programme for girls from various colleges to create awareness in women about laws & Constitution.

### 5. Student Support and Progression

#### 5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

IQAC of the University as well as the IQACs at Constituent Units undertook the following initiatives for bringing awareness about student support services.

- The students are given orientation programme about the various shared facilities available in respective campuses i.e. bank, hospital, gym, canteen, playground, travels and central library.
- Guardian Faculty Member (GFM) gives information about the student support services like Medical Hospital, Library, Reading Room & internet, Bank etc.
- The support services are communicated through emails and are also displayed on website and notice boards
- The IQAC has instituted a committee of faculty members to look into student support and progression activities and complaint management system.
- Student representatives are nominated on various committees of the institution so that their views and suggestions are considered in all major decisions related to student support services.
- The student handbook which is given to all students at the beginning of the semester mentions about students support services and contact person/dept for the same.
- Regular meetings with foreign students cell
- SMS system is used for sending messages to students and parents.
- A student committee is formed with all the Class Representatives as its members wherein these representatives meet with Director on regular basis and give their suggestions on various issues for enhancing the quality of teaching.

#### 5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression

- Conduct periodic unit test and practical exam for tracking the progression
- Students are provided guidance and counselling services on one to one basis based on their performances.
- The college compiles the student progress twice a year and communicates with the parents to help them understand their capabilities.
- The progression of the students is tracked through various systems such as - Teacher ward system, daily attendance reports, continuous evaluation by internal examination and meetings with parents.
- Result analysis is carried out after every examination and students unsuccessful in various subjects are counselled and remedial courses are organized for them.
- Mentoring is an ongoing process. The primary objective of a mentoring program is to develop the capacity of a mentee to serve a cause. Each faculty mentor has a batch of 15 student mentees with them.
- Regular observations are made by class coordinators to check academic progress of the students.
- Parents log in on ERP to monitor the continuous progress of their wards.

- All Masters students are trained for Exams conducted by rating systems such as GRIHA, LEED and ECBC Master Trainer Course by College of Architecture, Pune.

### 5.6 Details of student counselling and career guidance

The University has established cells for Counselling, Placement training and Career guidance in each of its constituent units. Some of the major activities undertaken by these cells during the year are listed below:

- The Training and placement officer of Institute of Hotel Management and Catering Technology, Pune assists the students by guiding and counselling them in assessing the career opportunities and choosing their career path. The Institute has signed a MOU with Global Education Management services, UK, represented by Mr. Frederick Young, Director-GEM to assist students to gain work experience and placement in UK, Australia, China and Middle East.
- Stress management workshop was conducted by Medical College, Pune for its first year UG students in 12 batches of 40 students each in the physiology practical cycle.
- Dental College and Hospital, Pune is organizing CDE programs every year by external experts for career guidance. Alumni of the college also provide guidance and counselling to students regarding the future carrier options in India and abroad.
- College of Ayurved, Pune provides guidance to its students for self employment.
- Faculty of the College of Nursing, Pune guides and councils its students. Records are maintained through counselling forms.
- Entrepreneurship workshop was organized by the Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Information Technology and Biotechnology, Pune in collaboration with VAMNICOM.
- Guest lectures on research opportunities in European Union Commission were organized in various constituent units of the University.
- College of Engineering, Pune conducts special programmes called 'Saturday at BV' with senior corporates for mentoring and career guidance for students.
- New Law College, Pune through its Judicial Examination Training Centre, All India Bar examination Training Centre provides training to its students for placement. The college publishes a placement brochure every year. A placement website is in place to guide the students on the various placement opportunities and other recruitment activities.
- Lectures on career opportunities in pharma and other industries are arranged by Science Association committee of Yashwantrao Mohite College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Pune. The college also invites career counsellors to guide the students on how to face an interview.
- Institute of Management and Entrepreneurship Development, Pune profiles its students and accordingly arranges skill enhancement sessions. The Corporate Managers and Alumni mentor the students. The students are also counselled by a professional psychologist.

#### 6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

Yes. Management Information Systems (MIS) are available in the University as well as in all the constituent units for timely report generation. Some of the major MIS applications in the University are listed below.

- Patient records, laboratory reports are computerized; HIS software( Life line) is installed in medical hospital
- Academic progress and attendance records can be accessed by parents as well.
- Tally-ERP software is being used for finance management..
- The administrative system in the colleges is automated with appropriate software and all information on student admission, examinations, marks, fee payments, etc is available for timely decision making and actions.
- All relevant information about the University and constituent units is published on the respective websites for reference.
- Alumni portals are maintained by some of the constituent units..
- Enterprise resource Planning system is used for facilitating and managing the administrative and academic work in College of Engineering, Pune and Institute of Management and Research, New Delhi. Further, ERP systems are used for marking the attendance of the students, sending the messages to their parents. It also facilitates Leave Management, Teaching Plans, Report generation, library management etc.

### 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- The curriculum of B.Pharm & M.Pharm have been thoroughly revised after taking feedback and views of past and present students, academic peers, and experts from industries.
- Institute of Environment Education & Research, Pune has introduced internship with credits at University of Cologne as a part of the curriculum.
- College of Engineering, Pune has established administrative setup consisting of Course Coordinator, Program Coordinator, Curriculum Improvement Committee (CIC), and Department Advisory Board (DAB) for curriculum development.
- The College of Engineering, Pune has introduced courses on Professional Skill Development as a new subject for imparting soft skills, analytical skills, interview techniques, preparing a CV, Group Discussions etc. during the first three years of the programme.
- Field Work Curriculum in Social Science Centre, Pune is updated.
- CBCS is implemented for three undergraduate programmes on experimental basis.
- Simulation software was introduced in the syllabus of programmes in architecture so as to meet current demands of the profession.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Students are encouraged to participate at state and national level Quiz organized by respective departments
- Medical Education Technology workshops are conducted for the staff members during 2014-15.
- Student centric interactive teaching learning methods are adopted including student seminars, Quiz, Field visit etc.
- Feedback received from the stakeholders has been effectively utilized for improving quality of teaching-learning process.
- Intensive Clinical Teaching has been introduced using live demonstration of the patients and watching patient's video to understand various Speech, language and hearing disordered population and their assessment with intervention.
- Use of Visualizer for clinical demonstration like wire bending as well as live demonstration in patient mouth for undergraduate as well as postgraduate students in the subject of orthodontics is introduced.
- The programme outcomes are evaluated by Rubrics method, where performance of students in curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities is taken into consideration.
- The teaching encompasses integration of learning through MOOC.
- Dr. Carsten Butsch, Professor from University of Cologne, Germany conducted a course on Urban Sustainability for M. Sc. EVST students IV Semester under the faculty Exchange Program.
- Initiated summer school at Germany on Sustainable cities where five students and 1 faculty will go for 3 weeks to Cologne in July.
- In-plant Training is introduced where a student has to undergo a training in any industry for 45 weeks and get himself exposed to the conditions and problems on the site
- NPTEL video lectures, virtual laboratories etc. is integrated as part of term work.
- Students are encouraged to watch video lectures available on YouTube

### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Conduction of regular formative examinations for medical students at UG level
- Practice of providing feedback on the performance of internal examination to the individual student.
- Review of University examination question papers in the respective Board of Studies meeting and suggestions are incorporated for improving the quality of question papers.

- A Virtual lab has been established to improve remote access to labs by faculty and students of the College of Engineering.
- Facilitated use of in-Pod, a portable software to promote collaborative, independent, and differentiated learning.
- Organization of Online webinars on different topics of curriculum.
- Enterprise resource Planning system is used for facilitating and managing the clerical work.
- CCTV surveillance through Intelligent Security System across the institute
- Digital reading room for students and faculty members.
- Establishment of Language labs.

### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- Feedback from the patients regarding the Hospital services and grievances thereof if any are collected and analysed and discussed at the Hospital committee meetings.
- Training of class III and IV staff in soft skills is regularly conducted
- A workshop “MIND POWER” arranged by Engineering College to improve planning and management skills among non-teaching staff
- Faculty development programmes are frequently arranged as well as faculty members are encouraged to attend such programmes outside institute.
- Regular promotion of the staff members as per the experience
- Orientation programmes for newly recruited faculty members.
- Deputation of faculty members to international universities and institutions of national importance such as NIT, NITTE etc. to pursue doctoral programs.
- Decentralization of administration and academic activities at university and constituent unit’s level.
- Recognition and awards to the staff members for their contribution and best performance on a yearly basis



### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- Recruitment of the faculty members is done as per norms of Statutory Councils and UGC.
- 342 faculty members in various Constituent Units were appointed during the academic year 2014-15.
- 66 non-teaching staff and 19 technical staff were recruited during the year.
- It may be noted that, only 5.5 percent of the teaching positions are vacant.
- Apart from the regular faculty, eminent academicians are appointed as adjunct professors and emeritus professors.
- Research Assistants are appointed through the University resources to assist Scientists in the research institutes.

### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

The industry interactions and collaborations with the universities which were initiated earlier were continued this year also. In addition, following new linkages and collaborations are established.

- Qaudio Devices, a company which manufactures hearing devices and audiometers has used the infrastructure of the department of ASLP to check the calibration and functioning of their newly developed audiometer
- Dental College and Hospital, Pune has linkages with Johnson and Johnson Institute Mumbai, Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Biotechnology, Young India, Rotary club of Khadki, Mukul Madhav Foundation, Mahatma Gandhi Hospital, IRSHA.
- Post graduate students/faculty of the Dental College and Hospital, Pune have undertaken research projects in collaboration with Poona college of Pharmacy, Institute of Biotechnology, Pune and Praj Metallurgy Laboratory, Pune and Ikon, Worli, Mumbai.
- College of Nursing, Navi Mumbai has collaborated with NMMC hospital Vashi, Wadia children & maternity hospital and Regional mental hospital, Thane
- The Industry-Institute Partnership Cell (IIPC) of Poona College of Pharmacy, Pune is currently coordinating research projects with different industries such as Hygienic Research Institute and Indus Biotech, Pune.
- The college has also established research collaborations with the Bradford University, UK, Reliance Industries, and Abbott. Mumbai.
- College of Engineering, Pune has established linkages with several industries for in-plant training and undertaking joint research projects. It has also signed MoUs with the University of Tokushima, Japan for exchange of faculty and students.
- New Law College, Pune has established linkages with Supreme Court of India and High Courts from various states for internship programmes.
- Yashwantrao Mohite College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Pune has established linkages and collaborations with national and international institutions, universities and other bodies, such as AMI (Association of Microbiologist of INDIA), Institute of Science and Technology (KIST), Seoul, South Korea, 'ARI' (Agharkar Research Institute), Haffkine Research Institute, Mumbai, 'National AIDS Research Institute' (NARI), Golwilkar Metropolis Labs, Serum Institute of INDIA, Pune, Dilasa Sanstha Pimpri, Pune, Elixir foundation for HIV Pune and Defence Institute of Technology, Pune
- IRSHA, Pune is developing programme with Baidynath Ayurvedic Industry and has established collaboration with Columbia University USA under CINHD programme to develop technology of infection resistant urinary catheter.

6.9 What efforts are made by the University/ Autonomous College for Examination Reforms?

- Choice Based Credit System was extended for some of the under-graduate programmes.
- Software which is capable of generating 22 types of reports is being used for paper setting work for all the University Examinations.
- Photographs of the students are printed/ affixed on the mark sheet of final examination of every course.
- Question papers of the theory examinations in Medicine are moderated and printed on the same day of the examination.
- Online tests are held for programs conducted in collaboration with National Stock Exchange as well as for internal examinations of some courses in management.

6.10 What efforts are made by the University to promote autonomy in the affiliated/constituent colleges?

- University has given full freedom to the constituent institutes to decide about implementation of curricula of various programmes and other activities.
- Autonomy is bestowed for academic planning, implementation and monitoring.
- The institutes have been conferred with full autonomy in respect of internal evaluations.
- The autonomy includes full administrative powers in their respective fields.
- The decision making is decentralized and all decisions pertaining to academic and administrative matters are taken through consultation and discussion with all faculty members and also staff wherever necessary.
- Systematic efforts are carried out to ensure decentralization. Various committees are constituted at both University and constituent institutes levels for empowering every faculty member and staff.

6.11 Activities and support from the Alumni Association

Alumni extends considerable support for successfully conducting various academic and extension activities. They share their experiences in many ways. A few instances are listed below.

- Alumni mentors students by providing opportunities to work under them in their organizations for internship.
- Alumni give their valuable feedback on current needs of educational reforms.
- The alumni guide the existing students to promote entrepreneurship.
- The alumni also provide valuable inputs for syllabus restructuring.
- Alumni also support by providing placement opportunities to our students.
- Alumni have sponsored Awards and Scholarships for the students with outstanding performance.
- Alumni have sponsored projects for faculty and students and extended financial assistance to organize seminars and conferences.
- Alumni has developed and installed an Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) software for the College of Engineering, Pune.
- Alumni has contributed significantly as resource persons and examiners.
- Alumni has extended help in organizing International Alumni Meet, International Law Fest, national workshops and various training programmes.
- A grand Alumni Association meet was organized on occasion of 50 years of completion at BVDU at which, around three thousand five hundred alumni were present.

#### 6.12 Activities and support from the Parent – Teacher Association

- Every constituent institute of the University has a Parent-Teacher Association which meets once or twice a year.
- The institutes take feedback from the parents regarding various academic and administrative processes. The feedbacks are analysed and appropriate actions are taken wherever necessary and feasible.
- At these meets academic performance of the wards and progress made by them are discussed. Suggestions are made by the teachers for improvement of their wards especially with respect to behaviour.
- Some parents help in establishing linkages with their organizations.
- Self-employed parents and those who are in senior positions in corporate proactively help students for industrial visits, in-plant training, provides sponsorships to college tech-fest, training programs and placement activity.
- Some parents participate as members of the IQACs of the constituent institutes.

#### 6.13 Development programmes for support staff

- The support staff of the hospitals are provided in-house training to increase awareness of prevention of hospital infection through hand hygiene practices and prevent needle stick injuries by proper biomedical waste disposals.
- Non-teaching staff is sent to various institutes for computer training and use of software.
- A workshop “MIND POWER” was arranged by College of Engineering to improve planning and management skills among non-teaching staff.
- Medical hospital of Bharati Vidyapeeth, Pune has organized seminars and workshops for nursing staff.
- Yoga classes, cultural programmes and recreational activities were organized wherein non-teaching staff participate
- A training program for laboratory assistants was held on maintenance of equipment.
- Workshop on Document Management Systems, use of excel and mass media communication tools was organized for non-teaching staff.
- A Support Staff Development Programme was conducted on ‘Computer Literacy, Drafting , Office Mannerism, Telephone Etiquette and Soft Skills’.

#### 6.14 Initiatives taken by the institution to make the campus eco-friendly

In addition to the efforts being put in previous years, the University and its constituent institutes have taken some more initiatives to make the campus eco-friendly. The major ones are listed below.

- Sewage treatment plant with a capacity of 4, 00,000 litres per day has been designed on the Educational campus at Sangli for treating domestic wastewater generated from the hospital, hostels, college buildings and canteen.
- Installed Solar panels on boys and girls hostels and utilization of solar lamps on the Sangli Educational Campus.
- Use of recycled waste water for garden.
- Decreasing use of plastic in various campuses of the University
- Cleaning of campuses as a part of Swatch Bharat Abhiyan
- Segregation & disposal of biomedical waste.
- Conduction of tree plantation programmes and creating awareness regarding global warming through NSS activities.
- Organization of lectures and research paper competition on green energy.
- Gift of tree samplings to the guests instead of bouquet of flowers.
- More than 700 plants placed in corridors / passages of the college. The students and faculty participated in the drive for cleaning the campus as well as the river Mutha and around the river.
- Energy Audit was conducted by College of Architecture, Pune and desired measures were undertaken.

**ANALYSIS OF THE FEEDBACK FROM STAKEHOLDERS**

Seventeen Constituent Units have taken a feedback from Alumni; 20 have taken from Parents; 12 from Employers and 26 from students.

While all 26 institutes have taken manual feedback, 8 institutes have used online mode also.

**Outcomes of the analysis of Students feedback:**

- The students have shown satisfaction towards conduction of lectures, tutorials, practicals and assessments.
- Discussions on the ideal answers of the questions of internal examinations found to be useful.
- Appreciated uploading of power point presentations of lectures on website.
- More community based activities and visits desired.
- Most of the students appreciated interactive teaching with more emphasis on student participation.
- Proposed to conduct more sessions for quizzes & seminars.
- Suggested to shift clinical posting of 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> semester students from afternoon to morning for medical colleges.
- To improve the library infrastructure in some of the constituent units.
- Need to introduce more skill based courses as well as soft skill development programmes.
- Expressed happiness over for conducting demonstrations, field visits, competitions, theme lunches, and food festivals.

**Outcomes of the analysis of Alumni feedback:**

- Majority of the feedbacks refers to the problem of networking.
- A comprehensive approach toward alumni ties needs to be developed further.
- Participation of alumni to establish linkages with industry.
- Most of the curricula adopted in different constituent units are in tune with industry requirements.
- Majority of the Alumni of various constituent units expressed their happiness towards the organization of alumni meet.

**Outcomes of the analysis of Parents feedback:**

- Parents appreciated teachers efforts in understanding the problems of their wards.
- Parents also suggested to start some add on courses in some of the constituent units.
- Expressed happiness over the facility of providing online results of the University examinations on the University website.

**Outcomes of the analysis of Employers feedback:**

- Involvement of experts from industry in designing the curriculum with the focus on industry demands.
- Enhancement in the internship from one semester to two semesters at undergraduate level and eight weeks at post graduate level by the University for architecture students was appreciated by the employers.
- Employers are actively involved in establishing the linkages for providing hands on experience for the students of professional courses.
- Employers are satisfied with the performance of students employed in different fields including industry.

**A) IN-PLANT TRAINING****1) Title of the practice**

IN-PLANT TRAINING

**2) Objective of the Practice**

The primary objective of In-plant Training is to correlate theoretical learning with practical experience in real environments. In-plant Training enhances the employability of students. The benefits of in-plant training include

- Exposure to industrial environment which cannot be simulated in the Institution.
- Inculcate professional ethics and discipline at work place.
- Understand the psychology of the workers, their habits, attitudes and approach to problems along with the practices followed at place of work.
- Familiarisation with various materials, processes, products along with their applications and relevant aspects of shop management.
- Opportunity to use acquired knowledge in problem solving and in project assignment.
- Understanding various work constraints in terms of time and cost within which goods are produced and services rendered.
- Learning to appreciate the need for co-ordinated effort of various persons at different levels in different departments in achieving the goals and targets set.
- Understand the scope, functions and job responsibilities in various departments of an organisation.
- Realisation of size and scale of operations in industry.
- Improvement in understanding of relevant application-oriented subjects in subsequent semesters.

The goal of In-plant training is not to specialize in technology or management, but to provide opportunity to learn under a different environment.

**3) The Context**

The students of the Engineering colleges are exposed to the practical aspects of Engineering only through the practicum conducted in the laboratories. However there is always a wide gap between the laboratory conditions and actual practices. The importance of this training is to make students interact with the industry and gain real time practical field experience, thus enhancing their career growth. This approach aids their overall professional development, thereby, helping them to create careers in the hi-tech, dynamic and competitive working environment.

#### **4) The Practice**

At the commencement of the sixth semester, the coordinator of this activity gets in touch with various discipline-specific prominent industries/organisations requesting them to offer In-plant training to the students. After receiving the consent from them, a list of industries offering In-plant training is made available to students. A list of interested students is compiled and sent to the concerned industries for their acceptance.

The In-plant training starts in June and ends in first week of August. This period of training helps students to make themselves available for the placement session which normally starts from the month of September. On completion of the theory examinations of semester VI, students join the allotted industry and undertake the training as per the schedule prepared by the industry. Few industries offer some mini projects, whereas some offer a structured induction training.

During this training the students articulate about knowledge gained, training received, technology experienced and interaction with managerial and technical personnel. Students maintain a log book, a specially designed activity record book, which is duly signed by the training supervisor assigned to them by the industry. One faculty from the department is also assigned as a training supervisor from the institute, who is in constant touch with the students.

Students regularly report the progress on weekly basis through emails. This helps in tracking the progress of the students and bringing their problems, if any, to the notice of the supervisor from the industry.

On successful completion of the training, students join back the institute to complete the remaining two semesters of the program. The students prepare a detailed report of their training and submit the same to the department. At the end of Semester VII the student appears for a viva-voce examination based on their training report. The external examiner appointed for this assessment is invariably a person from the concerned industry.

#### **5) Evidence of Success**

This programme for students was introduced to enhance the employability of students. The importance of this was to make students interact with the industry professionals and to gain practical field experience in industry practices.

Since introduction of this practice in the institute, it has been observed that the interest of the students in learning the courses has increased considerably. They could see the applicability of theory in industrial settings, which helped in bridging the gap in theoretical knowledge and industry practices.

In addition to this the students now being familiar with the industrial environment could make special efforts to acquire the qualities required for the profession. This has helped in improving the chances of student placement and also placement scenario of the institute.

The direct observation of the students by persons in the industry/organisation for at least six weeks has helped some of the students to directly get a job in the same industry/organisation.

#### **6) Problems encountered and resources required**

The major problems faced are related to placing the students in the companies of their choice. Usually students look upon for the MNCs and demand from various institutes for such companies is very high. However, number of students that can be admitted for In-plant training in any company is

limited. This problem may be overcome by considering the performance of the students at the university examinations while allotting the company. If students are selected for the companies which are neither nearby to Pune nor their native place, they face problems for accommodation and food. Many students do not get an opportunity to select the company as per their plan of future career.

Though no special infrastructure or resources are required to undertake this activity, dedicated efforts from the faculty members are required to maintain good rapport with the industries.

## **B) SOCIAL JUSTICE THROUGH CONTINUOUS AND LEGAL EDUCATION**

### **1) Title of the Practice**

SOCIAL JUSTICE THROUGH CONTINUOUS AND LEGAL EDUCATION

### **2) Objectives of the Practice**

Justice for all, resolving dispute without litigation, reaching to unreached is the prime concern of Legal Aid Centre of BVDU School of Law. The objectives of the practice are

- To Ensure Justice for all
- To promote Continuous Legal Education Program
- To train young advocates on family court practice
- To strengthen matrimonial harmony in the society
- To help women & children to solve their matrimonial disputes & to provide social justice to poorest of poor
- To understand the relationship of Law with other disciplines
- To develop overall personality of the students, and help them become professionally competent lawyers, inquisitive researchers, able administrators and conscientious judicial officers
- To produce socially responsible citizens, who shall be whole-heartedly and continuously engage in the process of nation building
- To develop organizational skills in the students.

### **3) The Context**

This practice is a humble and modest effort from the College to the Society by contributing to nation building. In this context, the major challenge is the rise in family litigation, less number of family courts, slow pace of gender justice, absence of political will to strengthen the judicial system in India. As a part of Continuous Legal Education Program, the Legal Aid Clinic provides a platform for amicable mode of settlement of dispute in family matters to common man.

The major challenge before the teachers is how to teach the subjects of Social Sciences with Law, so that, students study and understand law in the context of contemporary relations with society and be responsible to bring a sea change in the society.

### **4) The Practice**

The novelty of practice is to spread legal literacy and settle disputes amicably amongst the citizens and to set up alternative methods to redress the grievances thereby reducing the risks of litigation to a minimum.

The uniqueness of the practice is that these topics have been blended with the conventional teaching of Law subjects in such a manner that their study in turn proves beneficial for a law student to understand law and the intricacies of the legal profession.

Professional training to the students is an essential part of the legal education. The Legal Aid Clinic undertakes Continuous Legal Education Program, Legal Literacy Camps, Research Projects, Women Empowerment, Juvenile Justice, Protection of Rights of Senior Citizens, participation in Lok Adalat, Social Lawyering by PIL, social work through NGO's , Environment protection programs, free services in education related matters & Social justice to poorest of poor through NSS camps.

#### 5) Evidence of Success

This practice provides platform for amicable mode of settlement of disputes to common man. This practice supports the justice seeker in early resolution of their matrimonial disputes keeping their personal matters confidential, providing amicable solutions by legal experts at zero cost of litigation as per their convenience. This Practice through the Legal Aid Clinic is supported and guided by eminent practicing lawyers, marriage counselors' and family court judges.

During the year 2014-15, the Free Legal aid Centre received 668 applications for matrimonial legal issues assistance out of which 415 cases were resolved. The chart mentioned below classifies the number of cases resolved depending upon the nature of legal issues involved. Social justice was done through arbitration negotiation and meaningful counselling. The Centre has the principle of settlement by dialogue and not by litigation.
