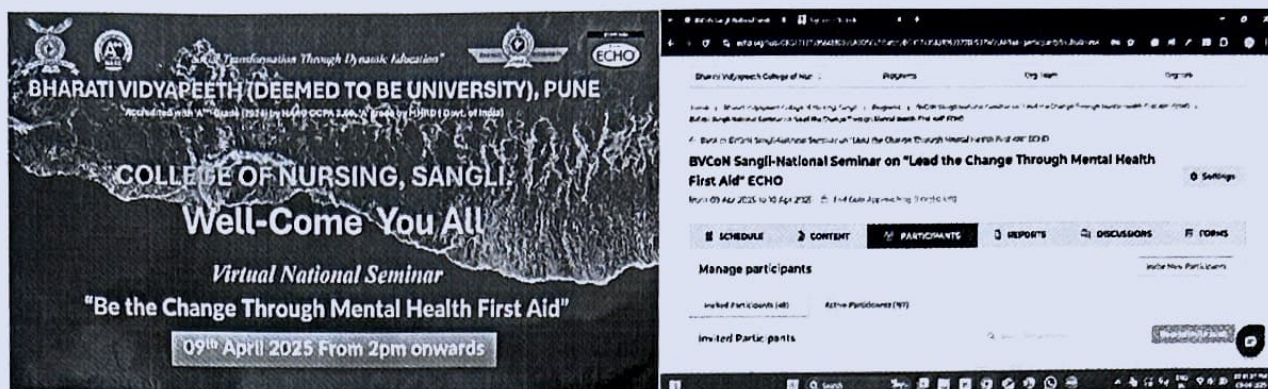
Welcome and Introduction

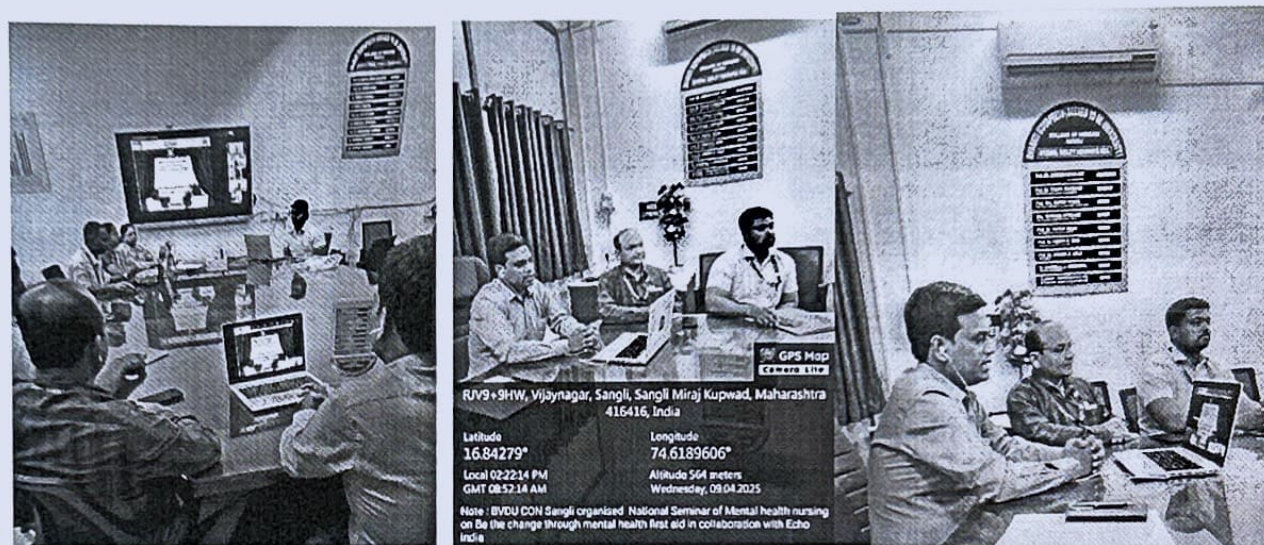

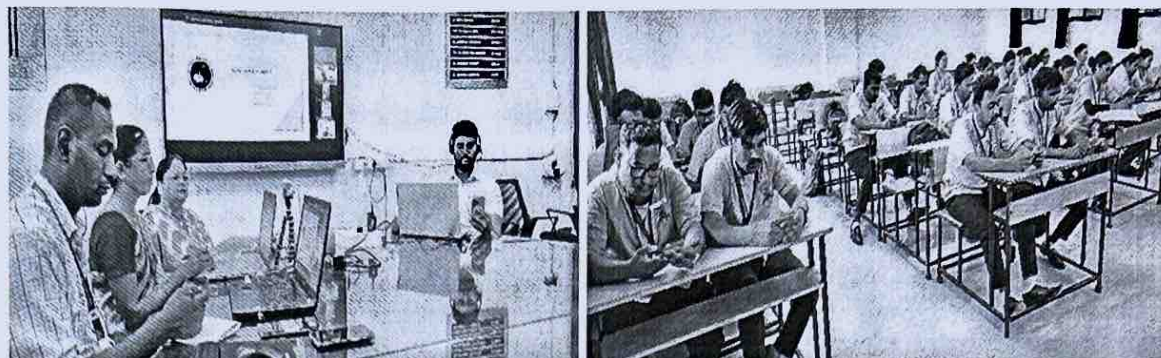


Introduction of Resource Person and Guest Lecture

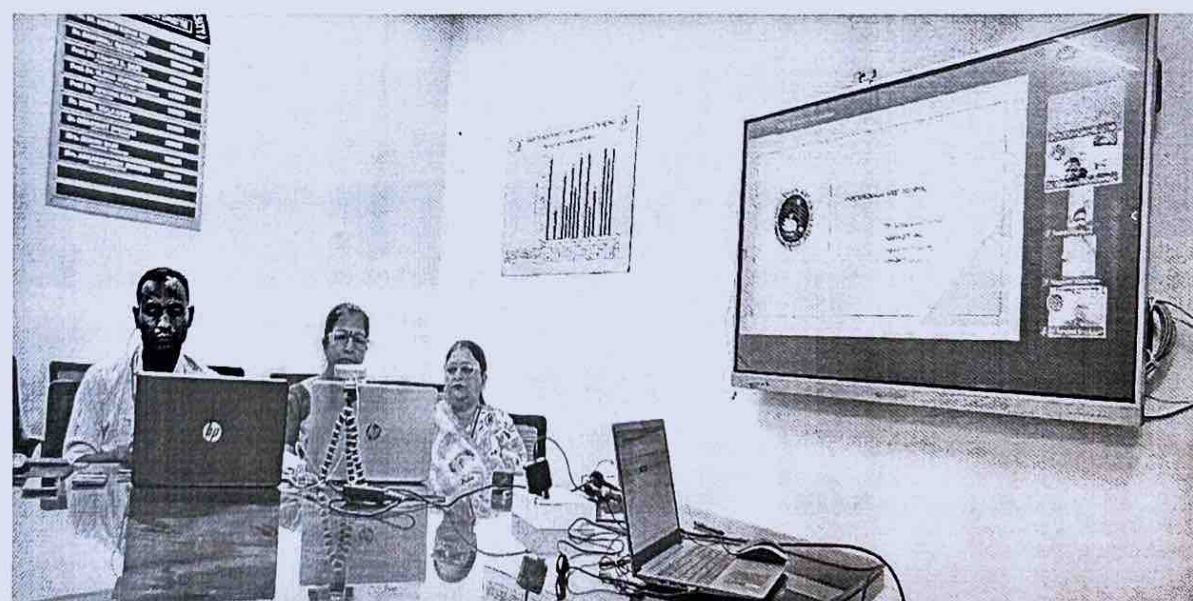
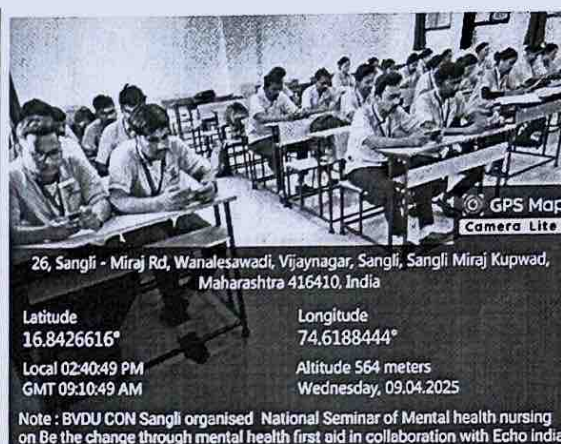
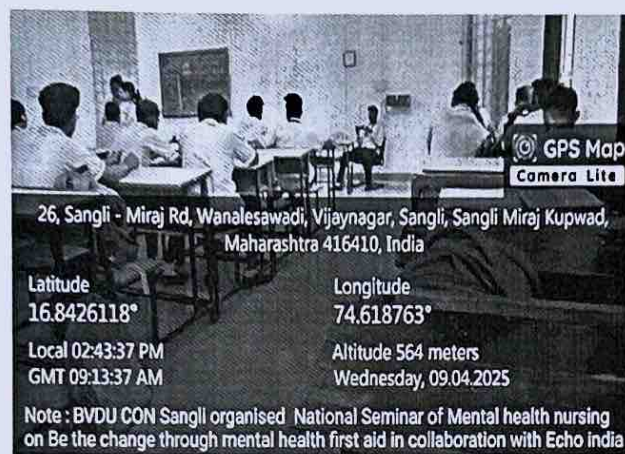

Research-Based Presentation

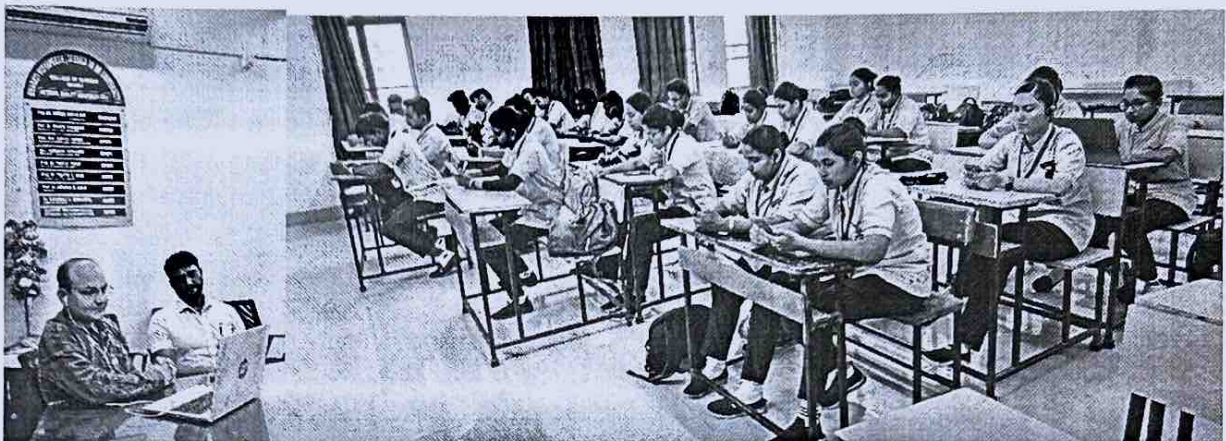

Feedback, Post-Test, and Certification

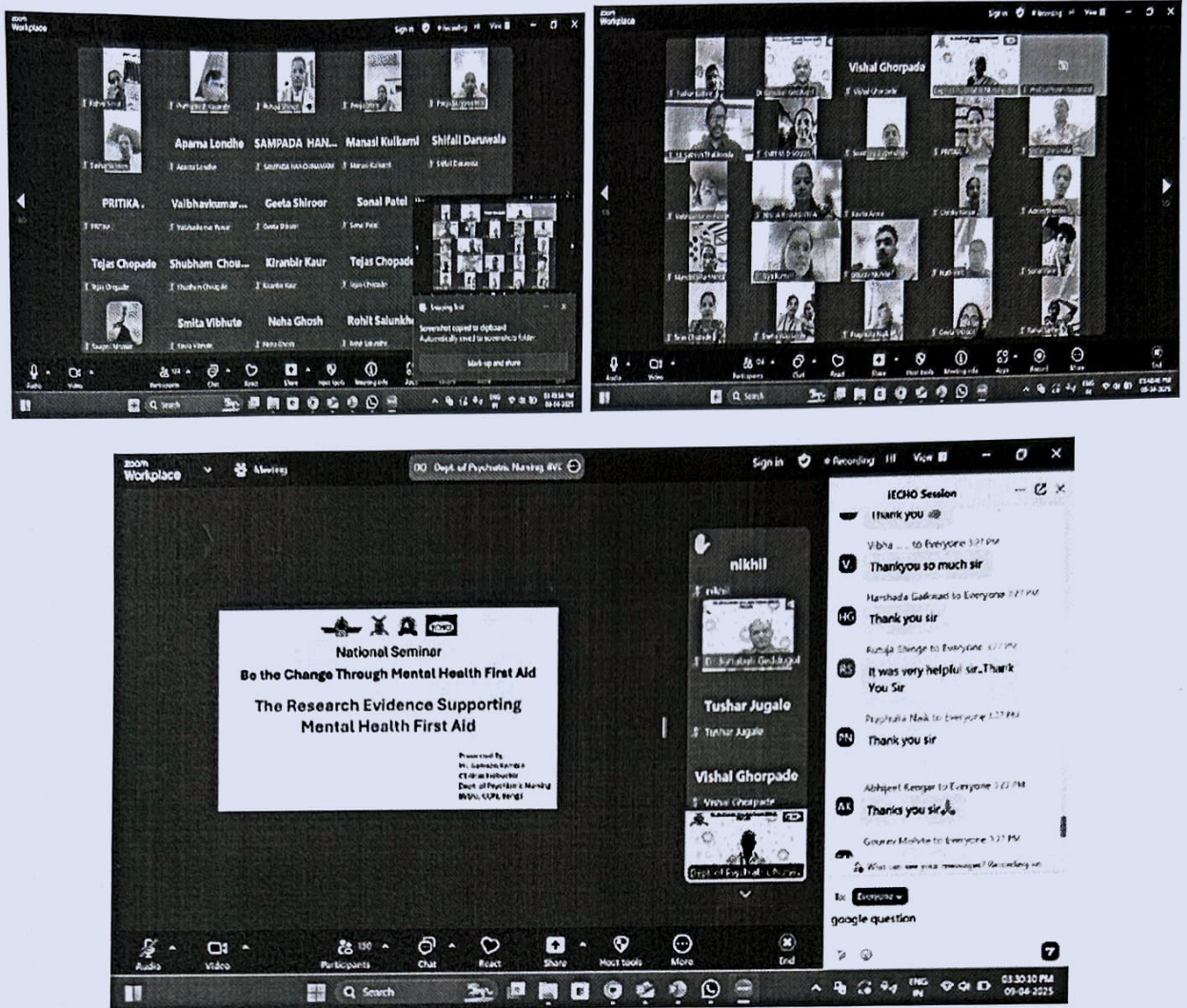
