A Professional talk was given for B.Sc. Nursing students on Five Rights of drug administration. Students were given teachings to follow five rights before administration of any medication viz. Right Patient, Right Medication, Right Dose, Right Time, Right Route.

The 5 Rights of Medication Administration Report

The 5 rights of medication administration are a fundamental principle in healthcare, designed to ensure patient safety and prevent medication errors. These rights serve as a checklist for healthcare professionals to verify the accuracy and appropriateness of medication administration.

1. Right Patient

The first right ensures that the medication is administered to the correct patient. Healthcare professionals must verify the patient's identity using at least two identifiers, such as their name

2. Right Medication

The second right confirms that the medication being administered is the correct one prescribed for the patient. This involves checking the medication label against the prescription or medication order.

3. Right Dose

The third right ensures that the correct dose of the medication is administered. This requires careful calculation and verification of the dosage instructions.

4. Right Route

The fourth right verifies that the medication is administered via the correct route, such as orally, intravenously, or topically. This ensures the medication is delivered effectively and safely.

5. Right Time

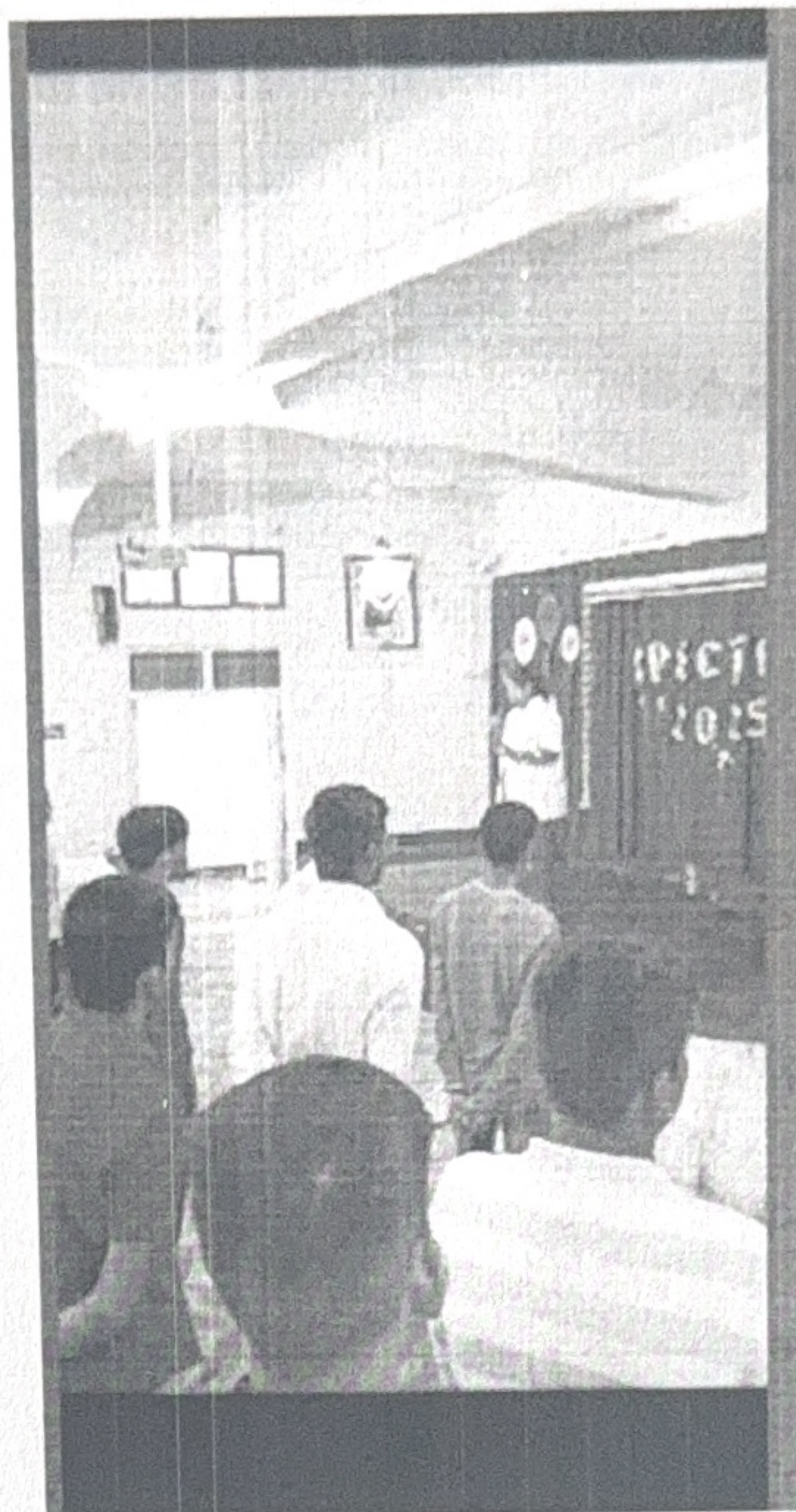
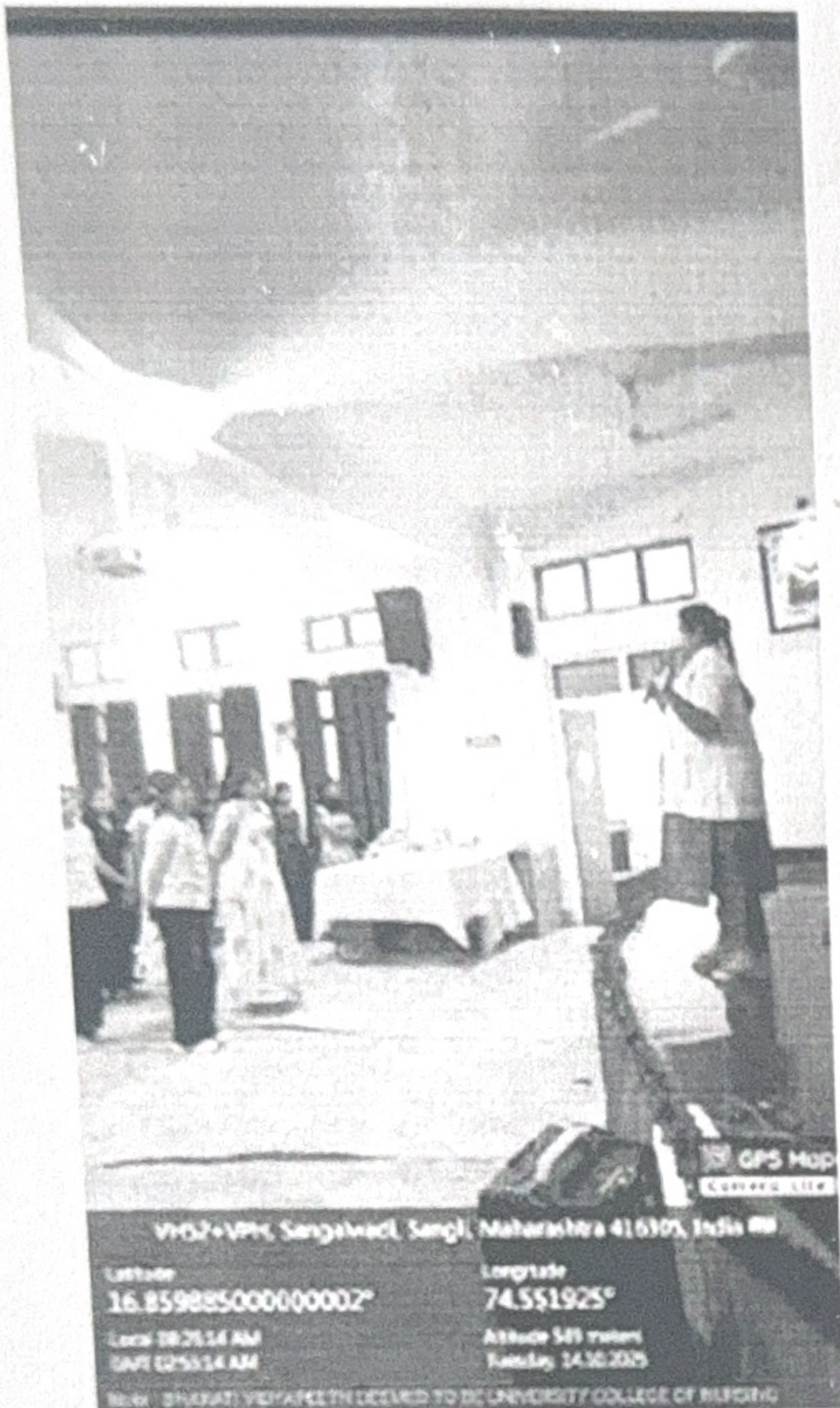
The final right ensures that the medication is administered at the correct time, as prescribed by the healthcare provider. This includes verifying the frequency and timing of the medication to maintain its efficacy and minimize potential side effects.


By adhering to these 5 rights, healthcare professionals can significantly reduce the risk of medication errors and provide high-quality patient care


