



EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOP ON NURSING EDUCATION

A two-day educational workshop on Instructional Planning, Audio-Visual Aids and Assessment in Nursing Education was successfully conducted from 20th to 21st December 2025.

The workshop was inaugurated on Day 1, followed by an expert lecture highlighting the importance of effective teaching and planning in nursing education. A pre-test was conducted and workshop objectives were explained.
