


## NSS Camp at Sukhwadi Village, Tal Palus, Sangli













The institute conducted the NSS Camp from 17th February to 21st February 2026 at Sukhawadi Village, Tal Palus, Sangli.

On Day 1, all participants gathered and a discussion was held with the Sarpanch of Sukhawadi village to plan the activities for the camp. Different groups were formed, and work began. Cleaning activities were carried out in various areas such as lanes, cremation ground, roads, and other public places. The collected waste was gathered in one place and disposed of by burning. The volunteers also counted the number of trees and electric poles and recorded the types of trees found in the village, such as Banyan, Peepal, Neem, etc.

On Day 2, the trees that had been counted earlier were painted with colors. Each group visited different lanes and painted the trees with saffron, white, and green colors. Electric poles were also painted and numbered to keep a record of the total number of poles and trees in the village. Additionally, the village temple was painted.

On Day 3, a special program was organized to celebrate Shiv Jayanti, which was conducted successfully. Guests were welcomed and a lecture was delivered as part of the celebration. After the program, the volunteers resumed their work and conducted a village survey (census). Information such as the number of family members in each household, their age, education, and mobile numbers was collected and later handed over to the village Sarpanch. On the same day, a Health Awareness Talk was also organized and conducted successfully.

On Day 4, the volunteers visited the nearby village Brahmanal and carried out a cleanliness drive at Brahmanal Ghat. As a fair had recently taken place there on the occasion of Mahashivratri, the area had accumulated waste. The volunteers cleaned the entire area, collected the waste, and disposed of it properly. Around 20 trees were planted in the area, and direction boards were installed to help people understand the routes.

A Haldi-Kumkum program was also organized for the women of the village. All women were invited, and during the interaction they were distributed sanitary napkins as return gifts and were advised to take proper care of their health.

In the evening, the NSS volunteers also participated in the annual gathering of the village school and entertained the audience with their performances.

On Day 5, On the final day, the volunteers reviewed the work completed over the four days and ensured that any remaining tasks were completed. All the documents and records prepared during the camp were handed over to the village Sarpanch.

A farewell program was organized, where the volunteers expressed their gratitude to the village and the Sarpanch for their support.
