





Binayak Datta Gupta Kolkatta









Mayank Budhbhatti Raipur


Mihika Agrawal Nagpur






















Raj Patel Surat

Sanket Ashk Prayagraj

















Sushant Welke Mumbai








Kunal Pandhare Jalgaon



















Rajas Rajopadhye Pune





Anikait Sharma Faridabad






Ishan Jange Solapur

Here are the shots from my film *Ek Cup Chai*, which is a story of an old man and his quest for companionship.














Ritwik Mohapatra Vadodara



Ansh Paliwal Kota



These are screen grabs from my short film which revolves around the story of an army officer interrogating a terrorist who is invloved in an attack.














Evan Thomas Faridabad




Prem Raut Bengaluru

To be honest, it's a whole lot of effort to choose your passion as your career, but that one beautiful take of the day makes it all worth it.














Yash Sharma Ajmer




Sharmin Daruwalla Pune
















Ashutosh Joshi, Class of 2017




Manthan Yadav and **Ajinkya** Patil Class of 2019
























Nikhil Padole Class of 2017


















Yadnyesh Joshi Class of 2016
