5.13 Major grievances of students (if any) redressed:

- New Law College, Pune students demanded to undertake extra-classes for difficult subjects like constitutional law, tax law etc. and to upgrade the Cyber Cell with new software and latest legal databases. These grievances were successfully redressed.

Yes. Management Information System (MIS) is in place in every constituent units of the University.

- Hospitals are automated through Hospital Information System (HIS), Lab Information Management System (LIMS) and Picture Archiving and Communication System (PACS).
- Staff attendance is monitored through biometric systems, whereas biometric and online attendance systems are used for students. Some units provide facility for students and parents to monitor their own/ward's record.
- Constituent units use a Document Management System (DMS) to archive required documents for current and future references.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- The curriculum of 1st, 2nd and 3rd year MBBS as well as courses in Audiology and Optometry were revised as per the recommendations of MCI and RCI regulatory councils respectively.
- Students are encouraged to participate at State and National level Quizes organized by various agencies.
- Feedback given by past and present students, academic peers, practicing dentists, external
 examiners and experts from other dental colleges are discussed and analyzed in the core
 committee. Suggestions on the curriculum of dental courses are forwarded to BoS for
 approval and further needful action.
- The change in the curriculum was adopted as per the INC guidelines and notifications by Nursing Colleges.
- Regular feedback on curriculum is collected from stakeholders and implemented in the curriculum.
- Workshops on curriculum development were organized by the College of Engineering, Pune.
- Professional skill development course is introduced in all semesters at UG level by College
 of Engineering involving soft skills, analytical skills, interview techniques, preparing a CV,
 group discussions etc.
- Four skill oriented MOOC courses are introduced by New Law College, Pune
- PG Diploma in Counselling and PG Diploma in CSR are included in the curriculum by Social Science Centre, Pune.
- Program objectives (PO) and Course objectives (CO) are identified in the Faculty of Management.
- The curriculum is designed and developed keeping in mind the industry requirements and the guidelines led down by statutory bodies from time to time.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Participatory teaching at undergraduate and postgraduate levels are adopted.
- Student centric interactive teaching learning methods like student seminars, quiz, field visit etc are used.
- The academic calendar is prepared in advance before the term starts and followed meticulously.
- All the libraries of the constituent units are enriched with books, journals and databases.
- ICT portal and lecture capture system are in place in some of the constituent units.
- Remedial classes for academically weak and repeater students are conducted.
- Master plan, Teaching plan, Rotation plan, Course plan are prepared every year.
- e- learning portal is available on the university website for round the clock learning.
- Hands on training through midwifery skill stations, neonatal resuscitation programme and rpaediatric skill stations given to students of the Faculty of Nursing.
- Technology enabled teaching learning process are practised.
- MoUs with a wide range of organisations both local, national and global have been signed by the Institute of Environment Education to enable students to be placed.
- In-plant training is introduced where a student must undergo a training in any industry for 45 weeks and get himself exposed to the conditions and problems on the site.
- New Law College adopts virtual classroom in addition to usual ICT methods for teaching.
- Skill based training programmes are arranged for students of Social Science Centre, Pune, such as Village development plans and village level microplanning, life skill education for adolescents and anemia intervention programme.
- Internal academic audit is conducted at the end of each semester in IMED.

FEEDBACK FROM STAKEHOLDERS

Outcomes of the analysis of Students feedback:

- Students' feedback has helped in improving the teaching learning process.
- Annual feedbacks from students are recorded in the appraisal performance Indicator (API).
- Based on the students' feedback appropriate measures like changing of library timings, number of books to be issued, new books to be purchased were implemented.
- Hands on learning and Clinical material by medical colleges was appreciated
- More patients needs to be enrolled in surgery department of Medical College, Sangli
- 95% of Dental College & Hospital, Sangli students were satisfied with question and answer sessions.
- Students of College of Nursing suggested that theory period for non clinical subjects need to be divided among nursing and medical teachers. Appropriate action has been taken. Further feedback analysis also revealed that teaching of the majority of teachers was excellent.
- Based on students' feedback on climate lab, all equipments were newly purchased in College of Architecture.
- Remedial classes & Bridge courses were introduced for the technical subjects & for non-commerce background students of Institute of Management & Research, New Delhi.

- Alumni have expressed their satisfaction on the quality of education imparted and placement activities in some of the constituent units.
- Alumni participated in conducting various soft-skills and professional advancement training programmes.
- Alumni may be further involved in strengthening linkages with industries.

Outcomes of the analysis of Parents feedback:

- Parents were happy with hostel facility of the University.
- Proposed to conduct communication skills and personality development programmes in Nursing Colleges.
- Parents express satisfaction with respect to infrastructure of the University.
- Parents express admired student development activities conducted by College of Engineering, Pune.
- Parents have appreciated system of information about the students' attendance and their performance, as well as examination results.

BEST PRACTICES

Best Practice: 1

1. Title of the practice: In-plant training

2. Objective of Practice:

The students of the Engineering colleges are exposed to the practical aspects of Engineering only through laboratory experiments. However, there is always a wide gap between laboratory conditions and actual practices. In view of enriching the practical knowledge of students and bridging the gap between academics and actual industrial practices, College of Engineering, Pune has introduced unique feature in the curriculum. Under this activity, every student must undertake in-plant training of 45 days in the relevant industries. Such in-plant training provides an industrial exposure to the students and develop their career in tune with the requirements of high-tech industries.

3. The Context:

With the constraint of keeping duration of engineering programme in accordance with that of the University it was difficult to decide period for in-plant training. After the VI Semester, normally students get 20 days vacation before commencement of the next semester. Further, by making minor changes in number of courses (subjects), the seventh semester could be started late by 25 days. This period could be utilized for the in-plant training of the students. Accordingly, number of subjects in seventh semester is reduced by one and its commencement delayed by 25 days. Thus, in-plant training of 45 days is introduced in course structure.

The in-plant training starts in june and ends in first week of august. This helps students make themselves available for the placement session which normally starts from the month of september.

4. The Practice:

At the commencement of the sixth semester, the coordinator of this activity gets in touch with various industries located nearby the city and prominent industries from distant places as well, requesting them to offer in-plant training to students. On receipt of the consent from industries, the list of industries is made available to students to choose from and data of the interested students are sent to the concerned industries which gives final nod to selection of students.

On completion of theory examination of semester VI, students join the allotted industry and undertake the training as per the schedule prepared by the industry. Few industries offer some mini projects, whereas few offer a structured induction training to students. Students maintain a log book, a specially designed activity record book, which is duly signed by the training supervisor assigned to him by the industry. One faculty from the department is also assigned as a

training supervisor who is in constant touch with students. Students keep reporting the progress on weekly basis through email. This helps in solving problems faced by students by contacting the supervisor from the industry, as well as tracking the progress of students.

On successful completion of the training, students join back to institute to complete the remaining two semesters of the program. He prepares a detailed report of his training and submits the same to the department. At the end of semester VII, the student appears for a via voce examination, which helps in assessing the knowledge of the student acquired during training program. The external examiner appointed for this assessment is invariably the person from industry.

5. Evidence of Success:

Since introduction of this practice, it has been observed that the interest of students in learning the courses has increased considerably. They could experience the application of theory in real life situation in industry and thus bridging the gap between academics and industry. Further this has helped in enhancing the placement in various industries.

6. Problems encountered, and resources required:

The major problems faced are related to placing students in the companies of their choice. Usually students give preference to MNCs for their placement. However, number of students to be admitted for in-plant training per company are limited. This issue may be sorted out by considering the performance of students in the university examinations.

Few of the students do not undertake the training seriously and do not perform to the expectations of the industry. The concerned industry refuses to offer in plant training to students in subsequent academic years. However, this number is very small, and institute needs to take additional efforts to sort out issues of this kind.

Though no special infrastructure or resources are required to undertake this activity, dedicated efforts from faculty members are required to maintain good rapport with industries offering in plant training to students.

Best Practice: 2

- 1. Title of the Practice: Tobacco Intervention Initiative Center
- 2. Objectives of the Practice:
 - a. Tobacco Intervention Initiative (TII) is a professionally-led "call to action" programme to eradicate tobacco addiction while striving for a `tobacco free India' and thus improving the oral health of Indians.
 - b. Tobacco use and smoking in particular, causes many of the chronic and debilitating diseases that affect the population and stress the national health-care system. It is proposed to spread awareness amongst the people through this centre by helping the patients to quit smoking and chewing tobacco habits.

3. The Context:

Considering the consequences of smoking and chewing tobacco the core committee of the department decided to establish Tobacco Intervention Initiative Center in the institute.

4. The Practice:

Institute has been authorized by Indian Dental Association (IDA) as an official Tobacco Intervention Initiative Center. Indian Dental Association (IDA) provides free material and kits to the institute. Provision for a separate area for TII center is made next to OPD so that patients with tobacco abuse habits can approach the center voluntarily. Institute has certified TII specialists who regularly counsel these patients.

Patients are graded for their dependency towards nicotine (Smoking and Smokeless), by Fagerstrom Criteria. Once the patient is graded for their dependency, patient is counselled in phases:

- a. Phase 1: Behavior counselling
- b. Phase 2: Behavior counselling + Medication
- c. Phase 3: Behavior counselling + Nicotine replacement therapy
- d. Phase 4 Behavior counselling+ Nicotine replacement therapy + Medication

All patients are reviewed on weekly and monthly recall visits and treated accordingly.

5. Evidence of Success

- a. Widely accepted by patients with tobacco abuse
- b. Positive feedback by patients.

6. Problem Encountered and Resource Required

Problem Encountered:

- a. Patients' reluctance in accepting their habit as addiction.
- b. Lack of awareness of tobacco abuse in low socioeconomic strata.
- c. Educating and motivating patient to quit habits is sometimes difficult task.
- d. All patients are not regular on their recall visits.

Resources Required for TII Center:

- a. BVDU Dental College and Hospital, Pune is equipped with the necessary supportive custom made infrastructure which is well ventilated. Self explanatory charts in both marathi and english languages are displayed. Booklets and other educational materials are made available to patients for understanding the consequences of smoking and chewing tobacco habits.
- b. Power point presentations of hazards of tobacco are prepared for better understanding of patients.
- c. A separate provision of counselling room with functional laptops having internet facility exists.
